NARRATIVE INFORMATION

Merseyside Sudanese Community Association is an independent registered charity, structured as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), that works with all the diaspora Sudanese community in Merseyside. It has taken over the work and role of the former Merseyside Sudanese Community C.I.C., which has been dissolved.

ACTIVITIES

In the last financial year the new organisation existed mainly in name only, only opening a bank account on 11th June 2018. This report therefore covers only a brief period of some 3 months, during which we operated from our premises, but under the old governance structure. During this period we planned the following educational project for our children.

Subscriptions from members, plus a grant from Awards for All (AfA) were our only income, with no expenditure against the AfA grant taking place in the reporting year, as the grant was only received 9 days before the end of the accounting period.

The Awards for All project: **Supporting Sudanese refugee children to achieve in their education**, as stated in our application, was: "to run a Saturday-school and Homework club during school term times for boys and girls from Sudan, most of whom have English as a second language. The sessions will cover Literacy: Reading, Writing and English, and Numeracy: Maths. This will ensure basic educational building blocks are available to participants; support will be from qualified Tutors; with one-to-one support to the children.

The project will also offer support to parents who do not have good English, so they can work more effectively with their children. We will track the children's performance, and offer extra support if needed. This will help strengthen the Sudanese community in Merseyside."

This will be reported on in our next Annual Report.

FUTURE PLANS

Our immediate plans were to run the above educational project, which [after this reporting period] we successfully did, and to run cultural activities for our expanding Sudanese community.

A newly-established Sudanese women's group, working within the association, was also developed and will be reported on further next year.

Independent Examiner's Report on the Accounts

Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees of Merseyside Sudanese Community Association

I report on the accounts of the Charity for the year ended 30th September 2018, which are set out on pages 2 to 4

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner
