Summary of the purposes of the charity as set out in its governing document	Para 1.17	To provide young people with a range of recreational, sporting, artistic and cultural opportunities which are both exciting and enjoyable and create social cohesion amongst the minority ethnic groups living in Birmingham. To give young people (10 to 25 years) access to a range of learning opportunities and challenging experiences, which promote their personal, educational and social development.

Para 1.17 and 1.19	We have continued to meet the purpose of our charitable organisation (as outlined above) by providing opportunities for young people living in Sparkbrook and from across the city of Birmingham. We continue to run boxing session (at an amateur level) seven days per week for young people who are interested in competitive boxing and for young people undertaking the sport for recreational and/or personal development purposes. In addition, we have continued to provide our services to people experiencing physical disabilities, special needs, and mental health issues.

In addition, our volunteers have delivered youth work sessions aimed at supporting young people at risk of educational and social exclusion to increase levels of confidence and positive selfesteem. The volunteers have continued to deliver character education which is incorporated into the coaching programme.
Other		In addition to the activities that we currently provide we were successful in acquiring in-kind funding from the Home Office to provide a bespoke website for our charity.

Para 1.20	We have had a productive year and have achieved the following outcomes: - We have maintained the numbers of young people accessing our service with approximately 140 registered members on our books. - Our monitoring figures show that on average between 50 to 70 young people attend the gym on any given weekday evening; and between 30 and 50 young people on Saturdays and Sundays (NB. Equating to approximately 850 hrs per week of gym usage or 44,200 hrs over the year). - We have maintained the number of contact hours spent supporting young people who are at risk of social and educational exclusion to increase levels of confidence and build positive self-esteem. - We have been successful in engaging the wider community through networking with other youth and community focused services, open days, and fun days. In addition, we held a boxing event that was attended by approximately 250 people from a diverse range of backgrounds from within the community.
