Achievements and performance

During this period of reporting we helped 682 people and clients had a yearly gain of £223,737.76.

We issued 89 Food bank vouchers to families in need. Universal Credit has proven to be an area of concern for clients and we assisted 55 cases. We helped the general public with 76 enquiries which included helping fill in the benefit forms. Employment and Support Allowance was another area where people needed assistance with 59 cases.

During the reporting period we helped 271 Banbury residents, 75 Cherwell residents, 1 City of Oxford resident, 26 South Northants, 6 South Warwickshire, 1 Buckinghamshire resident, 8 Bicester residents and 15 Bodicote residents, 5 West Oxford, 1 Vale of White Horse and 7 Out of area. It is likely we helped these residents on more than one occasion.

We recruited 5 volunteers in the advice department and a number of volunteers to the Carers Support Group.
