Report of the Trustees for the year ended 5 April 2019

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 5 April 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The Trust arose from an identified need to build up a fund to which schools can apply in order to increase their resources for developing their religious education and collective worship. The Trust was established in April 2008.

Its objectives, as described in the Trust Deed, are:

To promote and advance education in the Christian religion in the principality of Wales for the benefit of the public.

In furtherance of this principle object, to provide funds for the purchase of resources for the promotion and development of religious education and collective worship in Church in Wales and other schools in the principality of Wales, and to provide books and other materials for the purposes of religious education and collective worship in the principality of Wales.

These objectives were very close to the late Archbishop Alwyn's heart throughout his period in office, whether as a Parish Priest, a Cathedral Dean, a Bishop or Archbishop, and it was in his memory that the Trust was established.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable Activities

The Aim of the Trust is to give to teachers and their colleagues in any school who have enthusiasm and energy for RE teaching and collective worship the tools to share that enthusiasm with other staff and with the children they teach. The past year has demonstrated once again that we are a small Trust but one which has a special niche, a continuing impact throughout schools - far beyond the size of the specific Grants.

In a relatively small but critical way, we are investing in the future - the future of our children and our communities.

And, so that we can support appropriately as many schools, teachers and pupils as possible, we do this in partnership with colleagues and networks in the Diocese. In particular, we are grateful for the input of the Diocesan Education Team and, in particular, we welcome as a Trustee Jennie Downes, appointed during the year as the Schools Officer for the Diocese. We are also grateful for and welcome the broad vision and support of Canon Chancellor Pam Powell and the Reverend Bob Griffiths.

With the continuing support of the 2014 Diocesan Offering and other donors, the Trustees have been able to consider innovative ways of supporting Collective Worship and Religious Education in all schools, not just Church Schools, in partnership with other organisations and people.

During the year, we have highlighted the developing importance of innovative local School and Church links as a practical way of supporting the aims of the Trust. For example, we awarded a Grant towards the creation and celebration of developments in the garden of Llandysilio School which formed part of their response to their Section 50 Inspection by strengthening community, church and school links; whilst at St John the Baptist VA School at Penymynydd the Trust supported the creation of a glass mural and of individual glass crosses for leavers - a continuing expression for everyone of their Christian values for pupils and staff. We continued to support schools in their raising awareness of other faiths and, for pupils at Borderbrook and Isycoed Schools, the Trust contributed to the purchase of the Delivery scheme of work which develops an enquiring approach towards RE.

In the last year, we awarded 12 Grants totalling £2,778.50, bringing the total amount we have granted over 11 years to some £19,300 to 104 successful Applications. Indeed we have an impact far beyond the size of the individual grants.

Reflecting and working with developments in the Diocese and the wider Church, we promote our role amongst the new Mission Areas and the ways in which we can support local Churches in their contacts and work with their local Schools, whether of Church in Wales or other foundation.

For this increasingly broad range of activity we are indebted to the commitment and expertise of the Trustees and to the support of our Patron, Mrs Meriel Jones, and of our Welsh Language Adviser, Mrs Bethan Roberts - both of them critical members of the team! To everyone, we give thanks.

And the Trustees could not perform their duties without the invaluable professional guidance of Llyr Williams of Swayne Johnson (Solicitors) and Melanie Langton-Davies and Joanne Baldwin of Gardners (Accountants), professional support in which they demonstrate also their own personal commitment and enthusiasm to the work of the Trust.

We emphasise that we work in a very collaborative, hands-on way with schools and their communities, and this Report demonstrates that this remains central to our purpose, particularly in the context of the changing scene of the Diocese. We look forward to developing these partnerships, for which we encourage and welcome Grant Applications.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
