

The guest speaker Ms Kimberley Priestley addressed the meeting highlighting the changes of "Living with and Beyond Cancer".

The story of cancer has changed greatly in the last 50 years. In the 1970's people were mainly dying from cancer within one year, in 1990 this had improved to 2.5 years and in 2010 it had improved to 10 years meaning people were living with and beyond cancer.

This change is due to improvements in treatment, diagnosis and

surveillance and while people are living longer, cancer is also on the increase. In 1990 1.2 million people were living with cancer and is estimated that by 2030 there will be 4 million.

report in 2013 called 'cured but at what cost' which identified that while people were living longer and treatment has improved, they were not living well and were struggling to adapt to life following treatment. Many reported money problems, work problems, and emotional and physical concerns. One patient described how they had been to hell and back and felt incredible alone after treatment.

Macmillan surveyed patients about their experiences and released a

These reports and other research into patients experience identified a need for holistic care and resulted in the development of a cancer care task force. A strategy revealing six priorities was introduced.

- Prevention of health (lung screening, obesity, etc. (1)
- (2) Early diagnosis – faster and less restrictive.
- (3) To establish patient experience as important as clinical effectiveness.
- (4) Transform the approach to living with and beyond cancer recovery package.
- (5) Make investment to deliver a modern high quality service.
- (6) Overall process of commissioning – GCC cancer alliances.

The strategy recommends that all cancer patients will be offered the recovery package by 2020 which includes;

HNA on diagnosis and end of treatment (talk about NHA)

End of treatment summary (treatment, effects and recurrence)

Cancer care review (GP)

Health and well being support including financial, emotional and practical.
