### TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

### Objectives and activities for the public benefit

The principal object of the charity is the provision of almshouse accommodation for single women who by force of circumstances and resources, are in need. Priority is given to women who reside in Huntingdon, and it is this group of people which forms the basis of the public benefit provided by the charity.

The charity carries out its objectives by:

- maintaining the external and internal features of the eight residential houses in George Street,
   Huntingdon, in a secure and habitable state, and
- advertising empty accommodation to the general public, and
- reviewing the condition of the properties, and carry out capital works after securing appropriate funding.

The Trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Trust's aims and objectives, and in planning future activities.

### **Structure Governance and Management**

The charity is an unincorporated association governed by our constitution which is dated 12 November 2012.

The trustees comprise 1 ex-officio trustee who is the current incumbent of All Saints and also St Mary's Churches in Huntingdon, 2 nominee trustees from Huntingdon Town Council and a maximum of 9 other trustees, and any new trustees are appointed by the existing Trustees.

Where there is a co-opted trustee vacancy, the remaining trustees endeavour to recruit a new trustee with relevant experience, skills and an empathy with the objects of the charity.

As part of their induction, new trustees are provided with a copy of the Constitution, the Trustees Handbook, the Residents Handbook, and various other relevant documents to enable them to gain a full appreciation of their duties and obligations as a trustee. The Trustees Handbook contains the charity's policies for trustee induction, risk management, investment policy and management of surplus funds.

The trustees meet on a quarterly basis to review the position and a standard agenda is adopted to ensure that all matters are covered.

The day to day administration of property management and residents issues is delegated to the relevant sub-committee, in conjunction with the Clerk to the Trustees, but all major decisions are either approved or ratified at a full trustees meeting. The sub-committees are:

- Residents' sub-committee;
- Buildings sub-committee;
- Finance sub-committee.

### Structure Governance and management (continued)

The charity is a member of the Almshouses Association which offers assistance, advice, guidance and encouragement to the numerous almshouse trustee bodies to enable them to provide suitable accommodation for people in need. The Association also represents these charities with the Charity Commission, Homes England, and the Regulator of Social Housing, the Land Registry and other Government departments.

### Achievements and performance

**Residents** - one of our residents left to go to a more 'sheltered' accommodation, leaving no 6 free from Wednesday 19th September until December 1st, when a new resident moved in. The Trustees reviewed details from 6 applicants and interviewed 4 of these who fitted the stipulations required as regards need. One lady was offered the residency and readily accepted and has settled in well.

The level of occupancy was therefore at the high level of 97%.

The Chairman and Clerk have made many visits of a social nature to ensure the residents well-being and two other trustees, likewise, have visited when required for practical/building and maintenance concerns as well as to ensure the peace of mind and contentedness of the residents.

Residents receive cards and flowers on their birthdays and cards at major festivals, including a small grocery voucher at Christmas.

**Trustees** - Mr J J Humpston resigned on Oct 29th as he had moved out of the area and had been unable to attend meetings. Our ex-officio Trustee, Revd A Milton, retired and was replaced by the next incumbent, Revd J Randall, as from November 1st.

Mr D Bruce, a Trustee and Clerk, retired at the end of February.

The trustees invited retiring Trustee and Clerk Mr D Bruce and his wife, residents and some other local dignitaries to a 'Farewell' afternoon tea at the George Hotel in Huntingdon, where a presentation was made to him in grateful thanks for all he had done during his time as Trustee and Clerk 2012-2018.

The Trustees decided that as Mr D Bruce was retiring that it would be appropriate to designate the role of Clerk as a separate paid position and they were very pleased to appoint Mrs B Howells to this post from 28 February.

Two new trustees have joined us, Revd J Randall and Councillor A Blackwell, one replacing the retiring Vicar of St Mary's and one as a result of local council elections. It was noted that there is still a potential vacancy for someone with a legal background in property and human resources.

At the end of 2018 there were 10 ex-officio, nominated and co-opted trustees, leaving 2 vacancies for new trustees, and the trustees are committed to having a Board of Trustees with varied but complimentary skills to benefit the charity.

### Achievements and performance (continued)

The trustees maintained their awareness of their own performance framework established in 2015 as follows:

- To maintain a high level of attendance at trustee meetings, and this was noted at 84% for 2018, as was 2017. As one trustee, mentioned above, had been unable to make the meeting for a while, this is hoped to improve even further.
- To ensure a minimum of 4 quarterly meetings and this was achieved in 2018.
- To make available relevant courses for trustees and the Clerk. None were attended this year but this will be monitored in 2019.
- To confirm trustees' compliance with its own Trustees' Handbook, any requirements of the Almshouse Association, and regulators, the charity Commission. This was brought up to date and also through the normal process of management there was no evidence of any non-compliance.
- To review the risk register annually or more frequently as required and this was carried in 2018.

### Financial review and reserves

Date: 29<sup>th</sup> July 2019

The charity had a successful year achieving a surplus before transfers of £22,402 (2017 – surplus of £23,000) and the outstanding loans were reduced by £18,461 (2017 - £17,732).

The trustees prepare an annual budget and the results were in line with the expected results and the budget for 2019 shows the surplus being maintained and gives assurance to the trustees that the charity continues to be a going concern for the next 12 months.

The charity's policy with respect to reserves is to retain 12 months expenditure (excluding depreciation) in a separate account and 2018 confirmed that revenue expenditure and capital repayments amounted to approximately £40,000. At the end of the 2018 the charity had £40,493 in a separate deposit account to represent this reserve.

### NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

### 1 Basis of preparation

### 1.1 Basis of accounting

These accounts have been prepared under the historical cost convention with items recognised at cost or transaction value, unless otherwise stated in the relevant notes to these accounts.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: Accounting and Reporting by Charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 and with the Charities Act 2011.

The charity has taken advantage of the provisions in the SORP for charities applying FRS 102 Update bulletin 1 not to prepare a Statement of Cash Flows.

### 1.2 Going concern

The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis as the trustees believe that no material uncertainty exists. The trustees have considered the level of funds held, and the expected levels of income and expenditure for 12 months from approving these accounts. The budgeted income and expenditure is sufficient, together with the level of reserves held for the charity to be able to continue as a going concern.

### 1.3 Accounting estimates

No changes to accounting estimates have occurred in the reporting period.

### 2 Accounting policies

### 2.1 Income

### Recognition of income

These are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when:

- the charity becomes entitled to the resources;
- it is more likely than not that the trustees will receive the resources; and
- the monetary value can be measured with sufficient reliability.

### Offsetting

There has been no offsetting of assets and liabilities, or income and expenses, unless required or permitted by the FRS102 SORP or FRS102.

### Grants and donations

Grants and donations are only included in the SOFA when the general income recognition criteria are met.

### 2.2 Expenditure and liabilities

### Liability recognition

Liabilities are recognised where it is more likely than not that there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to pay out resources and the amount of the obligation can be measured with reasonable certainty.

### Governance and support costs

Governance costs comprise all costs involving public accountability of the charity and its compliance with regulation and practice. There are no material support costs incurred by the charity.

### Deferred income

No material item of deferred income has been included in the accounts.
