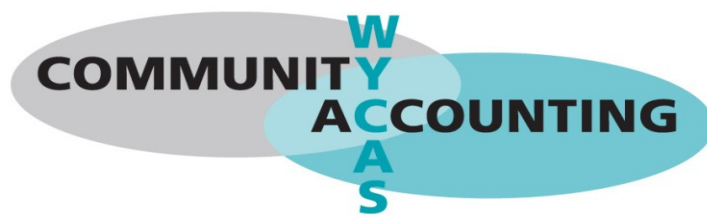

Objectives and activities

The charity's objects

The advancement of the Christian Religion by the proclamation and furtherance of the Gospel of God concerning His Son Jesus Christ the Lord and the preaching and teaching of the Word of God by the Church in accordance with the Statement of Fundamental Truths of Assemblies of God in Great Britain and Ireland as approved by the General Council from time to time.

The charity's main activities

Our Vision: To Exalt God, Equip People & to Excel Life-To provide for a group of Christians who worship in Havercroft West Yorkshire Promoting the Gospel of God, concerning His Son Jesus Christ the Lord. Church meetings are held every Sunday morning and evening with Sunday school for children, Thursday is Bible Study and prayer meetings. We aim to reach the community of Havercroft by serving them through our projects Coffee shop, Charity Shop, Drop In for mums, dads and grandparents, we open Monday to Thursday 9-12, in the Coffee Shop we serve a selection of tea and coffees and toast is available, four times a year we do a special full English breakfast, also our Lunch-In Club which operates on the first Friday of each month for the over 50s continues to be popular.

Public benefit statement

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our trustees have given serious consideration to the Charity Commission's general guidance on public benefit and in particular the advancement of religion. Our vision statement declares WE EXALT GOD, EQUIP PEOPLE AND EXCEL IN LIFE.

Achievements and performance

Ministry within the Church

During 2018 Pastors Zac and Jincy Zachariah have been the main ministers leading Sunday Services with worship and God's word, with a number of visiting ministers supporting and encouraging the Church, also the Pastors lead the Bible studies and prayer meetings. We have increased membership with new members joining. We have 5 Financial Accounting Funds. General, Missions, Charity Shop, New Building and Reserves. We contribute to this fund each month.

We continue to thank God for His Faithfulness and Provision.

We also continue to use the services of WYCAS to help ensure that our annual accounts comply fully with Charity Commission requirements.

Church Building

Last September we celebrated our ninth year in the new building.

The Church continues to be used as a Polling Station for local and national elections.

Ministry within the Community

Charity Shop Project

We open four mornings a week where regulars enjoy the opportunity to have a chat over a cup of tea or coffee with option of toast, opportunities to minister to those in need, the shop is well known for its bargains and customers love to browse and buy. The income from Charity shop is used to support specific needs that the church council agrees warrant such support.

Drop-In Project

Runs alongside Charity shop and Coffee shop projects 4 mornings a week during term time, and if volunteers available some school holidays opened as well, we provide a safe and secure environment for mums and dads to bring their toddlers, where they can meet and engage with others from the community we have craft days on a Thursday for the children run by our children's worker. Many of the children came to the Summer club during holidays went really well, with a seaside theme.

Achievements and performance (continued)

Coffee Shop Project

Runs alongside Charity Shop and Drop-In, great selection Barista coffee and tea, we serve toast and four times a year we do full English breakfast as a treat for our customers. (Food and Hygiene qualified workers).

Lunch-In Club Project

We celebrate the continuing success of the lunch-in club, first Friday in the month, we have certified level for Food and Hygiene qualified workers, our Food Hygiene rating level is 5 Star.

School Assembly

School team formed, lead by Pastors start next year in Havercroft school, preparations being made.

Food Bank

We continue to facilitate by transporting the food to their homes from the food bank in South Elmsall, for those in our community of Havercroft, Ryhill and South Hiendley, who have need to use the foodbank.

We also take donations of food to help with this service.

Financial review

Net expenditure for the year was £19, including net expenditure of £1,324 on unrestricted funds, net receipts of £2,380 on designated funds and net expenditure of £1,075 on restricted funds.

Reserves policy

The charity's free cash reserves at the year end were £19,289, made up of £13,280 designated funds and £6,009 unrestricted funds.

We are a village Church with an annual income on average of £44,000. The building is 9 years old and in general good repair although there are a number of pending jobs to be done.

It is intended to hold reserves to the equivalent of three month's expenditure. The trustees are aware of issues relating to the reserves policy and will discuss this during the current year with a view to revising it if appropriate.

We have regular income from church members and income from the charity shop, drop in and coffee shop plus the hire of the community room for a polling station.

1 Accounting policies

Basis of accounting

The trustees have taken advantage of section 133 of the Charities Act 2011 and have prepared the accounts on a receipts and payments basis.

There has been no change to the accounting policies since last year.

No changes have been made to the accounts for previous years.

Taxation

As a registered charity the organisation benefits from rates relief and is generally exempt from income tax and capital gains tax but not from VAT. Irrecoverable VAT is included in the cost of those items to which it relates.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the accounts.
