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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES for the year ended 31 December 2018

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objectives and aims

The company's objective, for which the charity was established, is to preserve the locomotive engine shed at Barrow Hill, Staveley, which is Britain's only surviving operational roundhouse. A roundhouse is an engine shed featuring a central turntable, which is used to turn locomotives and to give access to numerous storage tracks within the building. The site is operated as a museum and also provides locomotive storage and repair and maintenance facilities to commercial operators

Barrow Hill Limited is a 100% owned trading subsidiary of Barrow Hill Engine Shed Society Limited, and provides funds for the parent by gift aid. All trading activities are undertaken by Barrow Hill Limited, with the charity being responsible for the major restoration and enhancement of the site and buildings.

Public benefit

The charity carries out its activities in order to bring benefit to the general public. It brings real historical and educational value as it aims to educate the public about the history of the site in various ways. There is now a Learning and Access team which plays a large part in arranging school visits and family events, alongside the very strong Museum and Collections department which stages public displays and exhibitions. Barrow Hill is an Accredited Museum, recognised as such by Arts Council England under their Accreditation Scheme for museums. The site is open to the public each weekend from March to December.

A small admission charge was introduced during 2017.

The trustees confirm that they have complied with the requirements of section 4 of the Charities Act 2011 to have due regard to the public benefit guidance published by the Charity Commission for England and Wales.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

The completion last year of the building and renovation work following the award of a £1.176m grant by the National Lottery Heritage Fund laid the foundations for the Society to preserve the heritage of the site. During 2018, the activity phase of the NLHF-funded project began in earnest to attract new audiences and introduce more people to the heritage, promote an understanding of the heritage and help us to preserve it for future generations.

The new café is catering for increasing numbers of visitors and is being used as a meeting and event room for commercial customers. The Learning Room is being used for school visits and the new displays tell the story of the Roundhouse. We are now establishing ourselves as a place for schools and families to visit and we are attracting young people to the Roundhouse, which could lead to a life-long enthusiasm and dedicated new volunteers.

Visits from schools further out in Derbyshire have suggested to us that we are getting recognised on a wider scale as an exciting learning destination. The school and family events during the year have included a special Industrial Revolution themed day learning all about Richard Barrow, George Stephenson and the history of the Roundhouse, themed days focussed around the Science of the Railways and even a special archaeology dig to uncover the remains of the 'Long Row' workers houses in what is now our main visitor car park. Among other highlights for family events, the Roundhouse 'Science Fun' days attracted large numbers of visitors, including many happy children.

We also attracted a number of new volunteers during the period since the NLHF funding. Some have joined the Learning & Access team and others have joined the general volunteers either working with the engineering teams or as general stewards - all doing very valuable work on behalf of Barrow Hill.

In addition, the Roundhouse attracted a very distinguished visitor during the year, In October we had the honour of a Royal visit by HRH The Duke of Gloucester. He was very impressed with what had been achieved and how well we were looking after the Roundhouse to achieve a sustainable future.

The Roundhouse received several awards during the year, the first of which was the Mortons Media (Heritage Railway) Interpretation Award. The citation for Barrow Hill reads "For the conservation and restoration of a once common, but now unique, key part of British Railway Heritage and its accessibility to the general public through imaginative interpretation". Also, the winner of The Railway Magazine Annual Award for Services to Railway Preservation was our BHL General Manager, Mervyn Allcock, for his vision, drive, determination and passion over a 30-year period culminating in the realisation of the Barrow Hill Roundhouse project. Furthermore, in November we were selected by the Institution of Mechanical Engineers (IMechE) to receive their Engineering Heritage Award.

And it hasn't just been the museum that had a great year. On the commercial side, the reference in last year's report to the possibility of an investment in the site by East Midlands Trains (EMT) was realised. Major works at Derby during the summer led to Barrow Hill Roundhouse becoming an official EMT depot being used for servicing of several members of the Meridian and HST fleet. This required a large amount of permanent way work and installations which bodes well for future commercial activity, thereby strengthening our position further. The new facilities will look after the Roundhouse by continuing to provide a good income to safeguard the future and to protect all that we have worked very hard to achieve.

Looking to the future, we are hoping to purchase LMS steam locomotive number 41708, an 0-6-0 Johnson "Half-Cab" that dates from 1880 and is the only surviving long term resident of the shed (from 1947-65). Number 41708 was a regular visitor to Barrow Hill following restoration of the site and has been stabled in the Roundhouse since 2004. The purchase of this important locomotive (approved at the last Annual General Meeting) will be a further significant step in the historical and educational value of the Roundhouse.

Turning to financial matters, the funds held by the charity continue to be healthy and well placed to meet its reserves policy. At 31 December 2018, overall funds totalled £1,231,783 (£1,205,584 at 31 December 2017). Of that total, £520,880 comprised unrestricted funds and £710,903 restricted funds (compared with £451,645 and £753,939 at 31 December 2017).

The restricted funds referred to above are, as the term implies, funds whose use is restricted to a specific purpose, for example grants, and the majority of those funds during the year arose from the NLHF grant. Of the £1,170,600 awarded to the charity, we had used £1,030,566 (88%) at the year-end. Much of the remaining £140k will be focused on further family and children-related activities along with staff costs during 2019.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Overall net expenditure for 2018 totalled £302,784 including depreciation charge of £169,873. The principal non-NLHF element of that expenditure arose from residency for a composer and visual artist (£13,160 - covered by a grant), the annual bridge maintenance (£5,000), repairs to the 0-4-0 Drewry shunter "Harry" (£2,421) and 12% of expenditure not covered by NLHF grant including wages, projects and events. Other expenditure including upgrading the electricity supply in the Roundhouse (£6,366), completing the conversion of the second floor of the water tower (£5,505), water drainage and sewerage work on the site (£2,716) are included in additions to assets.

Overall net income for 2018 amounted to £328,983. The principal non-NLHF element comprised donation from Barrow Hill Ltd (£89,218), grant income (£36,160), membership subscriptions and donations (£7,578), Top Link sponsorship (£1,750) and social evenings (£1,200). A further significant contribution towards that income was received in the form of a £48,138 legacy from the estate of Mrs B H Green, the widow of long-term Barrow Hill supporter, Arthur Green. It has been decided that this kind and generous donation should be designated towards a proposal to build a replica of the Coaling Stage that existed at the site. It is hoped that this will contain a new science area and will be closely linked with the 41708 project.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial position

The reserves policy of the Council of Management is to maximise income so as to provide reserves for further development and refurbishment of the site and to enable major repairs to be carried out. Closing reserves of £1,231,783 are sufficient for this purpose.

Reserves policy

The Charity's reserves policy is to attempt to ensure that there are sufficient funds available to meet the anticipated expenditure requirements for a minimum period of 12 months.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is a charitable company limited by guarantee and it was incorporated on 21 May 1997. The company was established under a Memorandum and articles of Association.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

New trustees are either elected by the Council of Management at a Trustees' Meeting or they are elected at the Annual General Meeting. Additional Trustees may be co-opted during the year by the Council of Management subject to their re-election at the Annual General Meeting.

Induction and training of new trustees

New Trustees are inducted at their first Council of Management meeting when the operation of the Charity is explained to them. They are also given copies of the minutes of previous meetings and relevant Charity Commission publications. New Trustees are familiar with the annual accounts as they are required to be members of the Charity when they are appointed and whilst they serve on the Council of Management.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS for the year ended 31 December 2018

1. CHARITY STATUS

The charity is a charity limited by guarantee and consequently does not have share capital. Each of the trustees is liable to contribute an amount not exceeding £5 towards the assets of the charity in the event of liquidation

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value.

Financial reporting standard 102 - reduced disclosure exemptions

The charity has taken advantage of the following disclosure exemption in preparing these financial statements, as permitted by FRS 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland':

the requirements of Section 7 Statement of Cash Flows.

Income and endowments

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Donations and legacies

Donations are recognised when the charity has been notified in writing of both the amount and settlement date. In the event that a donation is subject to conditions that require a level of performance by the charity before the charity is entitled to the funds, the income is deferred and not recognised until either those conditions are fully met, or the fulfilment of those conditions is wholly within the control of the charity and it is probable that these conditions will be fulfilled in the reporting period.

Grants receivable

Grants are recognised when the charity has an entitlement to the funds and any conditions linked to the grants have been met. Where performance conditions are attached to the grant and are yet to be met, the income is recognised as a liability and included on the balance sheet as deferred income to be released.

Investment income

Investment income is recognised on a receivable basis.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS - CONTINUED for the year ended 31 December 2018

2. ACCOUNTING POLICIES - continued

Expenditure

All expenditure is recognised once there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that settlement is required and the amount can be measured reliably. All costs are allocated to the applicable expenditure heading that aggregate similar costs to that category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated on a basis consistent with the use of resources, with central staff costs allocated on the basis of time spent, and depreciation charges allocated on the portion of the asset's use. Other support costs are allocated based on the spread of staff costs.

Charitable activities

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly to such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs

Support costs include central functions and have been allocated to activity cost categories on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Governance costs

These include the costs attributable to the charity's compliance with constitutional and statutory requirements, including audit, strategic management and trustees meetings and reimbursed expenses.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off the cost less estimated residual value of each asset over its estimated useful life.

Freehold property

- 25% on cost and 10% on cost

Plant and machinery

- 33.3% on cost and 10% on cost

Fixtures and fittings

- 25% on cost

Individual fixed assets costing £500 or more are initially recorded at cost, less any subsequent accumulated depreciation and subsequent accumulated impairment losses.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
