REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 JANUARY 2019

New Charity

This is the first Trustees report since registering the Fox Hollies Community Association CIO in August 2017.

The work of the Association has continued to expand and this is reflected in these accounts. We continue to work for the benefit of the residents of Acocks Green, with our work extending to support more people locally.

Our range of activities for older people has developed with projects based around wellbeing and social fitness and has been in part through building good relationships with other agencies locally. This has seen our membership for this age group grow steadily.

Lunch club continues to offer and important service for the housebound, disabled and socially isolated members of our community. Again, through building good relationships locally we have seen an increase in the number of referrals to this group. This has been supported by a committed group of volunteers ranging in ages.

As part of our offer locally, our Environmental Centre has seen a new lease of life over the past 12 months through a change in focus. The Centre now offers a range of volunteering opportunities for individuals of all ages throughout the year which include basics in gardening to developing the space for others to use. In November 2018, we were delighted to receive a 'Level 4 Thriving' award from the It's Your Neighbourhood Awards, as part of Britain in Bloom for the space. This was down to the excellent work of the volunteers who undertook the work.

The Association's Pre-school continues to be successful both in terms of numbers and quality of the work. This year has seen an increase in the development of parent Discovery Days which support parents to engage in their child's learning, as well as a range of interaction workshops for parents and children to play and learn together through cooking, craft and storytelling.

Over the past 12 months, as part of our community development work, the Association has worked closely with a number of agencies in Acocks Green to establish a Youth Work Steering Group to address the lack of youth provision locally. We have received financial support to conduct extensive research into the needs of 11-18 year olds locally, and to deliver the projects based on the findings of this work. May 2018, we published the Youth Report 2018 outlining the views and concerns of young people with recommendations. This has led to the development of a youth work project locally, which has been warmly received in the area and has seen the development of a youth volunteering programme as well as a parks programme aimed to tackling social isolation and physical inactivity during school holidays as well as promoting community cohesion.

In January 2019 we celebrated operating in the area for 30 years and looking forward to celebrating this milestone with our members and partners.

Once again the Association has thrived over this period and is enjoying a very successful time from which our community members are benefiting.

Structure, Governance and Management

Operating independently from government and from its funders, Fox Hollies Trustees have responsibility for policy, the establishment of priorities and full financial, employment, financial and legal responsibility for the Trust and its activities, services and assets.

We are also in the process of transferring to a CIO and have transferred some of the funds.

The Area

Fox Hollies is an area of Birmingham, England, situated on the edge of Acocks Green district. It is named after the Fox Hollies Hall estate.

It roughly includes the area around Fox Hollies Road (part of the A4040 Outer Ring Road), stretching from Acocks Green in the north, to Hall Green in the south. A council housing estate was built to the east of Fox Hollies Road in the 1930's, an area that suffers from multiple deprivation.

Staffing

Fox Hollies Community Association officers are responsible for ensuring the development of activities, supervision of staff employed and for volunteers and for the smooth management of FHCACIO. Other staff have specific responsibility for reception, administration, caretaking and cleaning and to support other FHCACIO services. As at January 2019 FHCACIO employed 3 full time and 15 part time members of staff as well as sessional workers for project work, and had responsibility for several volunteers.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Accounting convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entities (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of the Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included on the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources. Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Plant and machinery etc. - 20% on cost

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objectives of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
