Over this accounting period the charity focused its work on the local communities in Dorset dealing with dementia and memory loss, and their carers and support groups.

In addition to the above, the trustees have also provided services to the elderly and disabled in the local area, and to the local community.

A monthly carpet bowls event for people with memory loss and their carers has been undertaken at a modest profit. Weekly drop in sessions have been held at several local libraries and other public spaces with support groups for carers held regularly. Moving forward it is anticipated that the good works will be mirrored within other communities in the Dorset area.
