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AID INTERNATIONAL UK Report of the Trustees. YEAR ENDED 31ST OCTOBER 2018

Aid International UK Trustees are pleased to present their annual report and independently examined financial statements for the year ended 31st October 2018. The Trustees have adopted the provisions of the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP 2005) (Accounting Standards Charities Act 2011).

Trustees and their responsibilities

Charity trustees are the people who serve on the governing body of a charity. They may be known as trustees, directors, board members, governors or committee members. The principles and main duties are the same in all cases. Trustees have, and must accept, ultimate responsibility for directing the affairs of a charity, and ensuring that it is solvent, well-run, and meeting the needs for which it has been set up.

Organisation

Aid International UK is a UK based international relief and development agency registered in September 2007.

Aid International UK operates within an equal opportunities policy. The organisation is currently run through the services of volunteers and well wishers and does not have any paid employees.

The organisation main activities are to provide relief to victims of natural disasters and manmade disasters worldwide regardless of colour, race, and ethnicity. The organisation also facilitates rehabilitation back into communities by providing sustainable aid concentration on education and welfare projects.

 5) TO PROMOTE SUCH OTHER CHARITABLE PURPOSES AS MAY FROM TIME TO TIME DETERMINE.

The overall management of finance is the responsibility of all the Trustees acting on the recommendations of the Chairperson. The Trustees form the Management Committee who meets regularly to oversee the running of the organisation. The charity is governed by its constitution.

Main Activities and Achievements

We have achieved our targets for the year and we are very grateful to all members who donate which enable us to deliver on the above charitable objects.

From donations we have been able to fund support the poor and needy people in region of deprivation

We are now running after school and Saturday Islamic and Quranic classes at the EIC AI Masjid Trust Mosque in Edmonton for young people. We teach them Islamic values and Quranic reading. They are also taught how to behave and respect others in the society. The session is coordinated by the Imaam and delivered by sessional teachers. We also organised trips in that year as a way to tackle isolation.

Future Plans

The trust plans to continue its fundraising through the existing donor base and also through live TV appeals.

Our plan is also to raise money for more Hafiz in Bangladesh and other countries where many of these Hafiz students are very poor orphans who cannot afford their fees.

We want to further develop our Islamic school by introducing GCSE qualification in Arabic language.

We would like to thank all our donors, board members, volunteers and all our service users who have given their energy and commitment to achieve our objectives

Financial Review

Aid International UK main funding sources are from members, individual donations and fees.

Reserves policy

The Board has assessed the charity's requirements for reserves in light of the main risks to the organisation. As a result, the Board has established a policy whereby the unrestricted funds not committed should be held in reserve and maintained at a level which ensures that Aid International UK core activity could continue during a period of unforeseen difficulty. This policy is in early stages of development and the target amount represents at least six months expenditure. This will be reviewed annually.

1. Accounting Basis

The statements have also been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice (SORP) - Accounting and Reporting by Charities SORP 2005 issued in March 2005.

2. Taxation

No provision has been made for the taxation of the Charity's Income as it qualifies for the tax exemptions available to charities.

3. Income

All incoming resources are included in the Statement of Financial Activities when the organisation is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. All income received in that year were unrestricted and has no specific conditions attached to it but are spent within the organisation's aims, objectives and activities.

4. Resource Expendable

All expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and has been included under expenses categories that aggregate all costs for allocation to activities.

5. Aid International Salary Cost including NIC for the year was £199,499 which was paid to part time sessional workers/teachers.

Total numbers of part time sessional workers were 33 for this year.

One trustee was remunerated and received a payment of £17,413 from the education programme for teaching.
