Achievements and performance

The Trustees continue to be pleased with the progress being made.

The fund-raising team continue to have success in raising funds. These have enabled our continued operation on more secure footing. We have also instituted a budgeting team to optimise fiscal control.

Blackburn Foodbank continues to employ 4 part-time staff, and has run a number of projects relating to our core activities.

We currently have around 65 volunteers, and we are seeking funding to employ a Volunteer Co-ordinator and Project Manager.

The continuing roll-out of Universal Credit is still having a significant impact. 2018-2019 has seen an 11% increase in users of Foodbank.

For the year 2018-2019 Blackburn Foodbank provided assistance to the people of Blackburn with Darwen in the following areas:

- 10,186 individual 3-day food parcels (2017-18 9,159),
- Total food supplied 91,317Kg,
- Money Advice and debt relief, £220,000 of debt managed,
- Computing facilities and assistance with computing skills, CVs, job searches etc,
- Eat well for less cooking classes,
- Make and mend drop-in workshops, and
- Sign posting to other organisations who may help.
