Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year	Basildon Orthodox Community has promoted the Orthodox Christian Faith in Essex, through the provision of the Divine Liturgy and other forms of regular worship at All Saints Church in North Benfleet. Since 1 <sup>st</sup> January 2018, the charity has delivered 52 (weekly) Divine Liturgies on Sunday mornings and feast days, plus 30+ other services. Attendance to Sunday services has increased.
	We have a website, and publish a weekly e-bulletin containing spiritual and practical information and guidance on Orthodox Christian matters distributed to 100+ people weekly.
	During this period, we had 3 Baptisms, 4 Chrismations and one marriage. The priest regularly visits people in their homes, and in hospital, and meets weekly with other clergy.
	The church is regularly open on Wednesdays, and we have started to open the church to visitors on Saturdays.
	In Dec 2017 we started an outreach project in Tilbury (monthly services). Basildon Orthodox Community has helped support other Orthodox Communities in the UK, with donations provided to St. Fursey's Orthodox Church in Norfolk and regular donations provided to the Antiochian Archdiocese of the UK and Ireland. We have also made donations (of essential items) to our local charity Changing Pathways.
