Objectives and Activities

St Clement's PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the Vicar and with the other clergy in the parish in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social, ecumenical and the Diocesan mission action plan. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Parish Church, Branch Church, Parish Hall and the Curacy house.

Achievements and Performance

Review of the Year

St Clement's P.C.C. met 7 times (not meeting every month) with an average attendance of 80% with a full and varied programme of topics, together with guest speakers the church's financial and community prospects were discussed and action taken, where agreed ,to promote and instigate plans and proposals.

The Manchester Diocese Mission Action Plan (M.A.P.) was developed and several sessions took place with a final agreement in November submitted to the Diocese. St Clement's continues to promote it's place in the community and the church is host to many and varied activities such as Healthwalk, History society, a Book launch and as a meeting place for various groups. The Church has also hosted a number of concerts, which were well attended by the community. School visits and Christmas concerts have grown with near capacity attendances on several occasions. Community coffee mornings are ever more popular with growing attendances. The already established craft group provided a set of banners for our 150th anniversary year, these were much admired by many for their excellent workmanship. These banners will continue to be displayed as and when appropriate.

The benefice, which serves 3 churches. St Clement's two churches and Christ Church has once again held joint services, meetings and courses all taking place throughout the year.

St Clement's continues to adopt "A Safe Church Policy" and "A Vulnerable child and Adult Policy" these will be re-affirmed at the A.G.M. 2019. However new legislation means we need to keep abreast of developments and also the need to be aware of how quickly social media is changing peoples perception of our joint responsibilities to one another.

Our involvement with C.T.U.(Churches together in Urmston) again means that we have continued to hold joint services and supported the local carnival and in addition to Lent breakfasts several meetings were held throughout the year. The Church continued our heritage theme to encourage community engagement with the building's heritage and together with Church open- days we continue to see the visitor numbers increasing. We believe the community is greatly benefiting from our ability and desire to open our Church beyond our regular worship times.

The Branch Church and the Parish Hall continue to provide financial benefits as well as providing useful facilities to local community groups of varying activities.

Messy Church at the Branch church is very active, and is proving to be a popular focal point for the community however it still needs willing volunteers.

The Year Ahead

We were not successful with our application for a Garfield Weston grant, which would have transformed our capability to host even more events. Still on the agenda are the final east roof and Rose Window renovations, both of which the church will look into all possibilities to fundraise. The church will remain on the "at risk" register until the afore mentioned work is completed.

Financial Review

Total income for 2018 was £108668.00.and expenditure was £159698.00, this was on ordinary unrestricted funds as shown on the financial statements. We have paid the Parish Share in full and on time and earned a discount of £686.00 on the increased 2018 Parish Share contribution, which was £34903.40 The curacy house continues to be a regular source of income and the rent has been reviewed to £850.00 p.c.m., with a new short-term tenant moving into the property in October 2018. Income from the Parish Hall is very good due to long term regular hirers. Expenditure on the hall was required over the past 12 months to maintain it as a valuable community resource for the future.

Structure, Governance and Management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and stand for election to the PCC. From time to time members of the PCC attend training events relevant to their duties organised by the Diocese of Manchester and other bodies.
