TRUSTEES' ANNUAL REPORT

The trustees are pleased to present their report for year ended 31 March 2019.

Reference and administrative details

Reference and administrative details are shown on page 1, the trustees whose names are shown on page 1 served throughout the year unless otherwise noted.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Trust was created by Constitution, adopted 21st July 1989.

The Trustees have examined the principal areas of the Trust's operations and considered the major risks faced. In the opinion of the Trustees, the Trust has established systems to mitigate those risks to an acceptable level.

Objectives and activities

The objects of the charity are the study and practice of choral music, in particular church music in order to foster the public knowledge and appreciation of such music by means of public performance and to promote the development of the choir of Southwell Minster.

The principal activities of the Trust during the financial year were:

- 1. A concert tour of the Netherlands
- 2. A range of concerts throughout the year
- 3. Involvement of the local community in musical performance
- 4. Educational and team-building events for the choristers
- 5. Financial support for parents of choristers
- 6. Other related activities, both educational and social, to develop the choirs of Southwell Minster

In planning their activities for the year, the Trustees kept in mind the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

Achievements and performance

Concert Tour of the Netherlands 25th-30th May 2018

- The Rector Chori, the Assistant Director of Music, the twelve Lay Clerks (including auxiliaries), eleven
 of the boy choristers, together with four choir parents who acted as chaperones and group leaders,
 travelled to Loosdrecht in the Netherlands on 25th May.
- The parents/carers of the boys were asked to make a contribution towards the cost of their chorister's attendance on the tour, the remainder of the cost being met from SMCA funds. All boys were able to benefit from the tour regardless of their parents' financial contribution.
- Concerts were held in St Catherine's Cathedral Utrecht, Lebuinuskerk Deventer, and St Bavo Basilica Haarlem.
- The boys also enjoyed visits to the Speelklok Museum Utrecht, and the NEMO Science Museum in Haarlem as well as a number of recreational activities between the rehearsals and concerts.
- A tour along similar lines is planned for the Lay Clerks and Girls' Choir to Sées, France in 2019.

2 Concert programme during the year

Music in the Great Hall

- This popular series of Sunday night concerts is held in the State Chamber of The Archbishop's Palace, restored five years ago with funding from the Heritage Lottery Fund.
- Seven concerts were held during the year, including performances by The Southwell String Quartet; the winner of the 2017 Nottingham Young Musician of the year, Konya Kanneh Mason; a showcase opportunity for young musicians from The Minster School; and a Carol concert performed by the Girls' Choir. Local musicians Mark Hacking, Luke Green, and Stephen Cooper also performed as part of the series.

St Cecilia Concert

- The St Cecilia Concert has, for many years, been the highlight of the SMCA's musical and fund-raising calendar and the concert held on 12th October 2018 continued this tradition established by the former Rector Chori
- The Southwell Minster Choir, conducted by Paul Provost, and with soloists Simon Hogan (Organ), Richard Laing (Violin), Ruth Provost (Cello), and Thea Butterworth (Harp) performed Parry's Blest Pair of Sirens, and Songs of Farewell, together with Fauré's Requiem.

Lay Clerks' Concerts

 As part of the fund-raising activity for the Tour, the Lay Clerks performed two concerts in Southwell Minster and St Mary Magdalene, Newark.

Four Choirs

The choir participated in the 'Four Choirs' event at Leicester Cathedral.

3 Involvement of the local community in musical performance

- The Minster Chorale performed Handel's Messiah to an audience of over 350 people in December 2018.
- A 'Come and Sing' event in February 2019 attracted over one hundred local people to perform Haydn's Creation.

4 Educational and team-building events for the choristers

- The Boys' Choir enjoyed outings to Thorpe Lake, 'Clip and Climb', and a bush skills training day.
- The Girls' Choir went on a skating outing, a golf training day, and a trip to Coventry Cathedral.
- These events were funded entirely by SMCA.

5 Financial support for parents/carers of choristers

- Since its inception in 2011, the discretionary travel grant scheme has paid out almost £20,000 to the parents/carers of choristers with a home address more than seven miles from the Minster.
- The scheme, which is not means-tested, is a valuable recruitment and retention tool and has been greatly appreciated by the parents who have benefitted from it.

6 Other related activities

Choral Outreach Programme

- The Choral Outreach Programme, which has been running since 2010 (initially known as 'Sing Up'), is administered by SMCA and has been funded by the Chapter of Southwell Minster, The Heritage Lottery Fund, The Pilling Trust, and an anonymous private donor.
- Using the strapline 'Singing is fun! Singing is inclusive!', outreach activity into local schools has
 continued throughout the year encouraging children in the enjoyment of singing, both listening and
 performing.

The Thiman Collection

- Funded by a member of the Thiman family, the objective of this project is to create a physical archive
 of every known piece of music by the prolific composer, Eric Harding Thiman (1900-1975).
- After five years' work by Guy Turner (one of the Lay Clerks), the project is nearing completion and creates a national resource for further academic/doctoral research. The archive will comprise in excess of 1300 pieces and is referenced in the composer's Wikipedia article.

Southwell Minster Website

SMCA contributed £1,000 to the development of a new Minster website.

Refreshments team

The team provided refreshments to concert-goers at the Minster throughout the year, not just at those
concerts staged by SMCA. The profits are a valuable source of funds for the Choir Association as well
as being appreciated by the local community.

Old Choristers' Association

• It is intended to re-launch the Old Choristers' Association during 2019. The funds of the Association had been held in a dormant account for many years and were transferred to SMCA as a restricted fund in March 2019.

Financial review

- Total net assets as at 31st March 2019 were £35,528 compared to £34,912 as at 31st March 2018.
- Expenditure during the year on charitable activities, including tours, totalled £35,709 indicating a
 healthy turnover of funds i.e. the charity is spending its money on the purposes for which it was
 established.
- Funds surplus to short-term requirements are held in The Church of England Fixed Interest Securities
 Fund (Accumulation Shares), a holding in line with Church of England ethical investment policy. The
 shares performed well and increased in value by 3.6% during the year. The Treasurer monitors the
 value of the shares on a weekly basis and would alert the Trustees to any significant fall in value in
 order that they make an appropriate decision to sell some or all of the holding.
- The income and expenditure relating to the Utrecht Tour was spread over two accounting years so its net cost is not immediately apparent from the accounts. The net cost of the Tour was £13,564 after receipt of £8,042 in donations and other directly related fundraising activity
- It is the opinion of the Trustees that the charity remains in a robust financial condition.
