## **Aim and Purpose**

St Saviour's Parochial Church Council (the PCC) has the responsibility for co-operating with the incumbent, the Reverend Lee Mullen, in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical and also has responsibility for the maintenance of the church building and the church hall of St Saviour's Kings Road, Westcliff on Sea

## **Objectives and Activities**

The PCC is committed to encouraging as many people as possible to become part of the worshipping community and to participate in the many activities which the church organises and promotes. The PCC is fully involved in the planning of these activities and also gives consideration and makes suggestions to the planning of worship throughout the year. When planning the activities the incumbent and the PCC take into consideration the Commissions guidance on public benefit and the promotion of religion within our community, through prayer and teaching.

## **Achievements and performance**

#### **Worship and Prayer**

We continue to offer a wide range of services from traditional BCP to the more modern Common Worship services. The separate service booklets for each of the church seasons make these easy to follow. For more informal worship the services can shown on a screen and where applicable it is also possible to include video clips. This is particularly useful where the service is focusing on a particular area or a charity such as Samaritan's Purse On the 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday of each month we hold a 'breakfast service' in the church hall. This is a more informal service at which food is served. This continues to be popular and is attracting families, with young children, who feel more comfortable than in a more structured service in church. We are also working more closely with the other Anglican churches in the areaas well as with our neighbouring URC church and have hosted joint services with them, particularly during the Easter and Advent periods

The 'bug hotel' and wildlife garden in memory of the late Revd Carol Palmer has now been created and is starting to attract the hoped for insect life. Wildflowers are now starting to appear and mre will be planted in the coming seasons.

We are hopeful that in the coming year a new curate will be installed at St Saviour's and hopefully some of the work which Carol had started can be re-established.

The electoral roll for 2017 stood at 94 of whom 46 are resident within the parish and 48 outside. The average attendance each week during the year over all the services is around 60 although the faces vary from week to week. The number of weddings during the year decreased slightly although the ll but the number of baptisms has continued to grow.

We have two representatives on the Deanery synod who provide the PCC with a link between the parish and the wider area, reporting on matters such as the implementation of the Diocesan wide discussion 'Transforming Presence' as well as more local issues. The Deanery Synod also allocates

the annual parish share payable to the diocese. Our Vicar and lay reader also attend the Southend Deanery Chapter when possible. Sadly the Chakwell Group of Churches partnership. which connected churches of all denominations, has ,for the time being, ceased operations as. However the good relationship with Crowstone St Georges URC continues and as mentioned earlier we are reestablishing links with our two daughter churches and some services and other joint projects are shared with them.

## The Church Buildings

The Church

After many years of discussing the possibility of installing improved heating in the church, 2018 finally saw this happen; and not only new improved heating but new lighting also.. Following lengthy discussions with the DAC regarding the new system which we proposed to use, re[lacing our existing lighting chandeliers with a chandelier system which incorporated bit heating and lighting elements, a faculty was finally granted at the end of September and the new system was finally installed and ready for action on 20<sup>th</sup> December. The reaction to the new system has been very positive and it was wonderful to have it ready to show to the many people who attended the Christmas services.

With the installation of the new heating system and the associated costs of that, the plans for the new disabled accessible toilet and a small kitchen and refreshment preparation area at the west end of the church were put in abeyance. However the project is still very much on the agenda and we are currently fund raising for this project. Our application for a grant from Veolia has been declined but we are looking at other options. We do have pledges for about 25% of the cost and one of our members will be cycling from Lands End to John o'Groats raising funds for the project Plans have been drawn up and the Diocesan Advisory Committee have been contacted and have expressed support for the project. We now have to prepare a specification for the work and go out to tender

### Church Hall

General maintenance of the hall and kitchen has continued throughout the year with no major issues arising, The hall is now booked on most days and is a very important source of income for the church, With the increased use however does come an increased need to maintain the building in good order but our dedicated team of helpers make sure that everything is kept in good order.

#### **Pastoral Care**

Westcliiff has a large number of care homes housing a large and aging population many of whom have been members of the congregation in the past but who are now unable to attend church. To cater for their spiritual needs, services are regularly held in a number of the homes. In those places where services are not possible, communion is offered to any individual who wishes to take it. In addition to the vicar and the readers there are a number of lay members of the congregation who are licenced to administer the sacrements. In the week prior to Christmas, in conjunction with our neighbouring URC church, carol services are held in a number of the homes In 2018 sercices were conducted in 12 homes in the week leading up to Christmas.

Our organist has also started a 'Community Choir' which meets on the first and third Monday each month in the church and is open to anyone who wishes to come along and jus have a sing and a cup of tea and a chat. This has proved so popular that another session on the alternate Mondays at another church has also been started

Our toddler group on Tuesday mornings continues to be popular, with on occasions numbers having to be limited. Messy church is run during school holidays and again proves very popular.

## **Ecumenical Relationsships**

With the hopefully temporary demise of the Chalkwell Group of Churches St Saviour's has taken on the responsibility of organising, together with St Michael's and St Andrew's joint services during Lent and Advent as well as in the walk of Witness and open air service held on Good Friday. This service is open to anyone who wishes to attend regardless of denomination. We are still working closely with what is know known as Kings Road URC and have a good relations ship with them

#### Charitable giving

We continue to give financial support to various organisations, notably Christian Aid, the Childrens Society and the Essex Clergy Charitable Fund. We also continue to support the Kisezi Mission in Uganda and have made donations to a number of appeals during the past year. The PCC is currently reviewing the charities supported with a view to widening the scope of the giving.

#### **Financial review**

With the installation of the new heating and lighting system, which cost around £72,000, the year ended with an excess of expenditure over income of £78,532.00. With the decline in the stock market during the latter part of the year the value of our investments also declined accounting for much of the balance deficit. Fundraising continue to take place to offset the decline in funds and the congregation continue to respond generously when the need arises. However we are continually monitoring the situation to ensre that St Saviour's continues to be a viable organistation.

### **Independent Examiner's Report**

#### To the Parochial church Council of St Saviour's Church

#### Westcliff-on-Sea

This report on the financial statements of St Saviour's PCC, Westcliff for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> December 2018, which are set out in the attached Notes to the Accounts, Statement of Financial Activities and Balance Sheet, is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with section 145 of the Charities Act 2011 ("the Act").

## Respective responsibilities of the Trustees and the examiner

As Trustees of the Charity you are responsible for the preparation of the financial statements, you consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Act and that an independent examination is needed.
