To promote for the benefit of the inhabitants of Luton and its immediate neighbourhood the provision of facilities for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, financial hardship or social and economic circumstances or for the public at large in the interests of social welfare and with the objects of improving condition of life for the said inhabitants

Pink Gym (ladies only health and wellbeing services) is doing really well. We are reaching out to the disadvantaged women in the community and meeting their needs of providing culturally appropriate health and wellbeing services. Feedback has been very good from service users.

We also ran a few additional projects alongside our main gym activity:

- a. Muslim Women's Activity Project We received funding from People's Health Trust as part of the Active Communities grant. This project is running for 2 years for us to facilitate local disadvantaged women in isolation to create a social group and meet regularly. The meetings are helping to overcome the circle of isolation for these women as well as an opportunity to learn new skills and improve their health and wellbeing.
- Healthy Aged Project Facilitating health and fitness sessions for the elderly women to help with movement and mobility and prevent falls.
- c. Social Prescription Women are referred through their GP's to undertake gym session to improve their health and wellbeing.

Many of these women have developed into leaders themselves and have started volunteering with us or with other local community projects.

We have also continued to support local initiatives and worked on a few projects with some local voluntary groups including Inspire FM.

1) Accounting policies

The accounts have been prepared using generally accepted accounting principals in the United Kingdom. The accounts have been prepared on a going concern basis on the assumption that the Trust will continue to operate. Accruals accounting has been applied to all material items.

Depreciation is provided against equipment at the rate of 20% of the undepreciated cost at the end of the year. Freehold property is depreciated at the rate of 2% pa from 2018, when it was first brought into use.

2) Description of funds

Donations and grants received are immediately treated as restricted funds.

6) Loans

During the year to 30 November 2008 the trust purchased a freehold property at 7 Cardiff Road for £216,810, including solicitors fees of £810. The purchase was partly funded by a series of unsecured loans from the trustees and members of the Gym. The loans total £164,979 and are interest free. £50,000 was repaid, during the year.

7) Insurance claim

During the year to 30 November 2016 the trust received £155,000 in full and final settlement of an insurance claim, following a fire at the gym. The insurance monies have been accounted for as detailed below:

^{*} Of the £40,000 received for the gym equipment destroyed in the fire, £13,919 was used to purchase new equipment during 2016 and £14,347 during 2017, and £4,555 in 2018. The balance of £7,179 is being held as a credit to be used in 2019.

^{**} During the year rent of £9,000 was paid to Rashid Nazar, a trustee, under the terms of a commercial lease, dated 7 January 2016.
