Overview

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The Skegness and Winthorpe Parochial Church Council (PCC) acts as Trustees for four buildings; St. Matthews (Grade 2 listed), St. Marys Church (Grade 1 listed) and St. Clements Church (Grade 1 listed) and St. Clements Community Hall. In all four building both community and religious activities are promoted. We have one paid of staff the Parish Secretary in an administrative support role. The annual accounts reflect both the income an of being the church in Skegness. Additionally the PCC is part of the Skegness Group which includes the Parishe Peter and St. Paul Ingoldmells and St. Nicholas Addlethorpe.

Ministry Team

The ministry team consists of a Rector, an Assistant Priest, a Permanent Deacon, 2 Lay Readers and 4 ALM's.

Community Activities in Skegness

St. Matthews church is situated in the centre of Skegness and operates as a church and also a community hub

Childrens and Families Chaplaincy

Christian Assemblies were delivered to the six primary schools. Children from the local schools also visit churcl learn about the Christian faith in Skegness. The toddlers group meet weekly during term time and Messy churc meets monthly. The Omega group for the elderly meets once a month as do the Mothers Union.

Bereavement Chaplaincy

Memorial services were held this year which bring some comfort to the bereaved. New Horizons Bereavemen Support Group meet once a month to give support by providing friendship and encouragement.

Workplace Chaplaincy

The chaplaincy continues to work with a variety of different businesses in the area. Two working lunches were for business leaders. With the demise of Lincolnshire Chaplaincy service this is a particularly important link to businesses in the town and is going to be renamed – Link (Christians in the workplace)

Shoreline Magazine

The Shoreline magazine is produced monthly. Well done all who produce and support the Shoreline magazine.

St Matthews Church

St. Matthews is open every morning from Monday to Friday. The building is well used as a community hub and community events. Community events include the Friday morning pop-in when refreshments are served. Ther a service of morning prayer from Monday to Friday and services on Thursday at 10.30 and Sunday at 11.00a.m are also services for festivals, Saints days, memorial services, civic occasions and Remembrance Day services. The are also the usual pastoral services.

St. Clements Church/Hall

The church has services on Sundays at 09.30 with the exception of the first Sunday of the month and also on T at 10.30. There are also the usual pastoral services.

The hall continues to be popular with regular bookings and has made a profit.

St. Marys Church

The cost of upkeep of the Chancel is the responsibility of the church commissioners under an ancient liability k remainder of the building is the liability of the PCC.

There are services on two Sundays at 09.30. There are also the usual pastoral services.

Skegness Parish Office and Community Hub

Situated in St. Matthews this the base for the community hub and the Parish Secretary. We produce a weekly sheet which is distributed widely free of charge. The Parish secretary is supported by a number of volunteers v help with a variety of tasks.

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of accounting

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The PCC is a public benefit entity within the meaning of FRS102. The financial statements have been prepared the Charities Act 2011 and in accordance with Church Accounting Regulations 2006 governing the individual act of PCCs, and within the Regulations "true and fair view" provisions, it is also the first year that they have been prepared under FRS102 (2016) as the applicable accounting standards and the 2016 version of the Statement Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by Charities (SORP(FRS102)).

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the Income and Expenditure account when the charity is legally entitled income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Voluntary income received by way of donations and gifts is included in the Income and Expenditure accounts v Gross fundraising income from events organised by the charity itself is included in the Income and Expenditure accounts when received.

Resources expended and basis of allocation of expenditure

Expenditure is included on an accrual basis. Resources expended include attributable VAT, which cannot be recovered. Resources expended are allocated to the particular activity where the costs relate directly to that a

Restricted funds – these are funds that can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects o charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purpo Further explanations of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statemen
