

## Spay And Neuter Scheme for Feral Cats

### Activities and Objectives

Twinkle Trust Animal Aid continues to spay and neuter as many homeless cats as possible by carrying out trapping, neutering and releasing of stray and feral cats. In addition we help sick and injured cats and orphaned kittens and once the animal has recovered we search for responsible new homes when ever possible. With the help of regular volunteers we've achieved a great deal, we've neutered and treated many 100's of cats in the last year.

We continue to provide fresh dry food and clean water at over 18 feeding points for the homeless cats. We have additional, wonderful new volunteers which work along side the volunteers that have been with Twinkle for many years. We pass on our knowledge and experience of the physical hard work of catching cats and maintaining and replenishing our many cat feeding points, and give encouragement and teaching to likeminded animals lovers on how to care for and hand rear some of the many sad cases of orphaned kittens. Our primary aim is to neuter the homeless cats but will continue to help the unwanted and unheard voices of the cats and kittens that need help.

**Top right photo** is of 5 kittens who's protective mother had given birth to them in a field, and was attacked by a stray dog who killed one kitten and left the mother cat traumatised but not leaving her kittens side until we stepped in to help her.



**Bottom left photo** is an unneutered male cat, his injuries are from fighting which is what they will do until sterilised. Now he is sterilised and living a much healthier and more peaceful life.
