

### REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES

In October 2018, the Church moved from fortnightly to weekly public gatherings for worship, prayer, teaching and evangelism. Since January 2019 we have met on the first Sunday of the month for a 'bring and share' meal after the service, to create a greater sense of community. Since May we have started an evening prayer and worship service called 'Immerse'.

WayKids Church runs during each morning service which provide a safe place where children can have fun, make friends and explore faith. The charity has a Safeguarding Policy, which regulates all persons working with Children. The Church has also met in member's homes on a regular basis for fellowship, prayer and social events.

In all cases these meetings have welcomed and been open to the general public.

In January and March the Trustees agreed to start to employ Senior Leaders Jonathan and Jenny Mackwell for 7 hours and 6 hours per week respectively. This has allowed for greater pastoral care, further development of teaching and WayKids ministry.

The Church has also been committed to the support of Christian work among the poor and in other aspects both in the UK and across the world; specifically through the support of Youth With A Mission to a community irrigation scheme, Christians Against Poverty, the African Children's Choir, Scripture Union North East, Tearfund and Hope for Justice.

In December 2018, Waypoint Church hosted the African Children's Choir which performed at a local community centre with song and dance. This provided an amazing opportunity to the community to be involved and to enjoy a multicultural experience, £1748.90 was raised through the event for the African Children's Choir.

### 6. TRUSTEES AND OTHER RELATED PARTIES

A Trustee Mr J Mackwell, received a gross salary of £2,520.00 and pension contributions of £226.80. Mrs J Mackwell, the wife of Mr J Mackwell, received a gross salary of £1,440.00 and pension contributions of £129.60.

Both were in their capacity as Senior Leaders of Waypoint Church in furthering the Charity's objectives.

No other payments were made to trustees or any persons connected with them during this financial period. No other material transaction took place between the organisation and a trustee or any person connected with them.

#### 7. RISK ASSESSMENT

The Trustees actively review the major risks which the charity faces on a regular basis and believe that maintaining the reserves stated, combined with the annual review of the controls over key financial systems carried out on an annual basis will provide sufficient resources in the event of adverse conditions. The Trustees have also examined other operational and business risks which they face and confirm that they have established systems to mitigate the significant risks.

#### 8. RESERVES POLICY

The Trustees have considered the level of reserves they wish to retain, appropriate to the charity's needs. This is based on the charity's size and the level of financial commitments held. The Trustees aim to ensure the charity will be able to continue to fulfil its charitable objectives even if there is a temporary shortfall in income or unexpected expenditure. The Trustees will endeavour not to set aside funds unnecessarily.

### 9. PUBLIC BENEFIT

The charity acknowledges its requirement to demonstrate clearly that it must have charitable purposes or 'aims' that are for the public benefit. Details of how the charity has achieved this are provided in the Trustees report. The Trustees confirm that they have paid due regard to the Charity Commission guidance on public benefit before deciding what activities the charity should undertake.
