DIRECTORS' REPORT FOR 2018

Annual Accounts: our annual accounts, as agreed with Companies House and The Charity Commission, will from this year be produced for the calendar year.

Concerts: In March 2018, in Cadogan Hall, the CRS promoted the premiere performances of their new commission, *Battle of Britain*, composed by Richard M Brown with text & lyrics by Sarah Harding and Fern Dickson. With two full houses of children (1,800) dressed in exciting battle gear, the enthusiasm for this moving piece was evident and schools' feedback was appreciative. Ben Glassberg, winner a few months previously (aged 24) of Besançon's annual International competition for Young Conductors, guided the RPO and the entire audiences in song with a sure touch. Narrators Annabelle Brown and Jonathan Eio also shone. Guests included the Mayor of RBKC, the Deputy Lord Mayor of Westminster & our Sponsors.

In July, The CRS were again grateful to Trinity School for making their concert hall available during the rebuilding of Fairfield Halls. Just under 1,000 children and parents sang the *Battle of Britain* over two concerts, accompanied by the London Mozart Players conducted by Ben Pope wearing his father's naval uniform! Narrators were Annabelle Brown and Luke Francis. The Mayor of Croydon and a record number of Councillors attended enthusiastically.

In October, CRS promoted *FIRE!*, our popular commission of the Great Fire of London, in the Light concert hall, Euston. Karin Hendrickson conducted the London Mozart Players in two 'in-the-round' concerts with great aplomb and the vivacious narrators who played Samuel Pepys and his maid Jane were Tobias Deacon and Annabelle Brown. The two full houses included many new schools from Camden and Islington, who were made very welcome.

'Twilight' Workshops were held by the Conductors a few months in advance of each of the three concert days, for Teachers of participating schools. These are an invaluable tool, enabling teachers to explore the music, noting exceptional passages and ensuring a consistent approach. These workshops were highly successful and strengthened CRS ties with schools and teachers.

Stage Choir Workshops in school were also held by our conductors: selected schools relish this experience: to enter through the Stage Door, to their own back-stage Dressing Room, then a full rehearsal on stage with orchestra and principals, followed by two concert performances, the whole lasting from 9.15am - 2.30pm. They never seem in the least bit tired. Stage choirs this year were from St Mary Abbots Primary, Kensington, Forestdale Primary, Croydon and Queensbridge Primary, Hackney.

Financial Support: The CRS is most grateful to M&G Investments for their sponsorship since 2006 of the March concerts in Cadogan Hall. They also appreciated the continuing support for the Croydon concert of the HR Taylor Trust, Mott MacDonald, Croydon Council and Croydon Relief in Need and they give their sincere thanks to The Schroder Foundation for supporting the City concert held in The Light. They continue to be most grateful to Studio 108, who for many years have designed pro bono all the concerts' publicity and programme material.

Results for the period

The concerts in Croydon and in The City, although full to capacity, made losses this year, having not achieved the necessary level of sponsorship. The fulfilment of our stated remit, to give children 7-11yrs exceptional musical experiences through taking part in concert with top professional orchestras, conductors and narrators comes at a price. Income from full houses of children, some receiving free tickets through our hardship fund, usually covers 40%-50% of total costs.

Our Reserves Policy, which includes listing future, unsponsored projects, ensures that we embark on projects only if we are assured of our ability financially to deliver them.

Our Programme for 2019: We plan to produce our March concert in Cadogan Hall with the RPO and our October concert in Milton Court, Barbican with the LMP and the Guildhall School of Music Players. Unfortunately, due to the delayed re-opening of the Fairfield Halls, our next concert there is postponed until 22 June 2020 – and we have already taken several bookings! We also plan to re-introduce our Front Row project for secondary schools, which provides free front row seats at major, classical concerts, for 30-40 children interested in music, preceded by workshops given by the concert conductor and a soloist, to provide an in-depth understanding of the music, prior to their concert attendance.
