Structure, governance and management

The method of appointment of PCC members is set out in the Church Representation Rules 2006. All Church attendees are encouraged to register on the Electoral Roll and to stand for election to the PCC.

PCC's responsibilities

The PCC are responsible for preparing the Annual Report and financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

The Charities Act 2011 requires the PCC to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Church and its financial activities for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the PCC members are required to:

- a) select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- b) make judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- c) state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements.
- d) prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation

The PCC are responsible for keeping proper accounting records that disclose with reasonable accuracy at any time the financial position of the Church and enable them to ascertain the financial position of the Church and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with Charities Act 2011. They are also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the Church and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

CHURCH OF ST JOHN THE EVANGELIST, RANMOOR ANNUAL REPORT OF THE PAROCHIAL CHURCH COUNCIL FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

The PCC members confirm that so far as they are aware, there is no relevant information of which the Church's independent examiners are unaware. They have taken all the steps that they ought to have taken as PCC members in order to make themselves aware of any relevant information and to establish that the charity's independent examiners are aware of that information.

Objectives and activities

St John the Evangelist's PCC has the responsibility of co-operating with the Vicar in promoting in the ecclesiastical parish the whole mission of the Church, pastoral, evangelistic, social and ecumenical. It also has maintenance responsibilities for the Church Building and grounds of St John the Evangelist, Ranmoor Park Road, Ranmoor, Sheffield, S10 3GX.

Electoral roll

There are 247 parishioners on the Church Electoral Roll. 19 names were added during the year, 2 were removed who have died.

Review of the year

The interregnum that commenced in the summer of 2017, continued in 2018 until we were delighted to welcome the Revd Canon Dr Matthew Rhodes who was licensed on 17th September. Matthew was appointed to the incumbency as well as being appointed to the role of Area Dean of Hallam Deanery.

The church building remained closed until late August 2018, as it took until March 2018 to obtain the necessary consents for the ceiling repair to be started. During the closure parish worship was undertaken in the Ranmoor Parish Centre.

The combination of an interregnum and the church building being closed was very challenging at times, particularly for couples who had planned their weddings during the period. The uncertainty of how long the repairs would take meant that the Parochial Church Council decided to inform all couples who were planning their marriage during the year that the church building would not be available. Three options were given, to move their wedding to another venue entirely, to get married at one of the seven churches that are located on or church boundary or to postpone their wedding.

Consequently, 10 weddings were moved away entirely, 9 weddings were held in neighbouring churches (5 in Fulwood Christ Church; 2 in St Augustine's and 2 in St Mark's) and 2 weddings were postponed. These arrangements were very time consuming and often stressful. We appreciate all the support given to the wedding couples by members of St John's and our neighbouring churches. The St John's registers were used for all the weddings undertaken in neighbouring churches.

Throughout the interregnum we received fantastic support from our team, paid staff, volunteers and retired clergy. Also, the Bishop's Chaplain, the Diocesan Registrar and the Diocese were regularly challenged by our requests for guidance on legal issues that emerged, such as wedding regulations.

Our musicians continued to adapt to support our worship, in the temporary arrangements throughout the interregnum. We were delighted to be overwhelmed by our congregation at Easter, with the Centre's Garden Room full with our choirs and overflow congregation in the corridor

Following the removal of the scaffold, it was unfortunate to discover that fine dust had penetrated the church organ, it was declared unusable and work commenced to obtain consent for its restoration. The chamber organ was also affected. By the year end an application for a Faculty had been submitted for the organs to be cleaned and renovated. It is about 30 years since the church organ last had a major restoration and, along with the dust, a lack of use through the 10 months of the church building being closed had not helped the instrument's condition.

In September we were able to celebrate Alison Wragg starting her final year of training to be a Reader and Janet Noble commencing the one-year Authorised Children's Minister course.

Our Pastoral Care Team, comprising nearly 50 people, continued to provide welcome support to help people through difficult times. 2018 was a particularly challenging year for the team, we appreciate all that they do – often without being noticed by anyway except the recipient – to support God's presence in our Parish

Our annual seaside outing was to Robins Hood Bay and Whitby, a good time was had by all. We also had several fund raising events: a cheese and wine evening with a talk from the Lord Lieutenant of South Yorkshire, a talk about life in a medical practice, Harvest Supper and quiz, and a celebratory lunch on the re-opening of the church.

Finally, the most important aspect of life at St John's is the presence of God in our lives. There are many ways in which people demonstrate their faith through their work or as volunteers; thank you to you all.

Financial review

Total incoming resources on unrestricted funds were £210,941 (2017:£214,578 and resources expended were £201,682 (2017:£257,398) leaving a surplus on unrestricted funds for the year of £9,259 (2017: defecit £42,820).

Reserves policy

Matter pliedes

It is PCC policy to maintain a balance on unrestricted funds (if possible), which equates to approximately six months' unrestricted payments, to cover emergency situations that may arise from time to time. The balance of £360,311 on unrestricted funds at the year-end exceeded this target.

INDEPENDENT EXAMINER'S REPORT

I report in respect of my examination of the charity's financial statements carried out under section 145 of the Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act.

An independent examination does not involve gathering all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently does not cover all the matters that an auditor considers in giving their opinion on the financial statements. The planning and conduct of an audit goes beyond the limited assurance that an independent examination can provide. Consequently I express no opinion as to whether the financial statements present a 'true and fair' view and my report is limited to those specific matters set out in the independent examiner's statement.

- · accounting records were not kept in respect of the charity as required by section 130 of the Act; or

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

1 Accounting policies

The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Church Accounting Regulations 2006 together with applicable accounting standards and the Charities SORP 2005.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention except for the valuation of investment assets, which are shown at market value.

Funds

General funds represent the funds of the PCC that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use and are available for application on the general purposes of the PCC. Funds designated for a particular purpose by the PCC are also unrestricted.

Restricted funds are those funds that must be spent on restricted purposes and details of the funds held and restrictions are provided in note 9. Endowment funds, where the capital must be retained, are explained in note 10b.

The financial statements include all transactions, assets and liabilities for which the PCC is responsible in law. They do not include the financial statements of church groups that owe their main affiliation to another body, nor those that are informal gatherings of church members.

Incoming resources

Voluntary income and capital sources

Collections are recognised when received by or on behalf of the PCC.

Planned giving receivable under Gift Aid is recognised only when received.

Tax recoverable on Gift Aid donations is recognised when the donation is recognised.

Grants and legacies to the PCC are accounted for as soon as the PCC is notified of its legal entitlement, the amount due is quantifiable and its ultimate receipt by the PCC is reasonably certain.

Funds raised by concerts and similar events are accounted for gross.

Sales of books and magazines from the church bookstall are accounted for gross.

Other income

Rental income from the letting of church premises is recognised when the rental is due.

Income from investments

Dividends are accounted for when due and payable, and interest entitlements are accounted for as they accrue. Tax recoverable on such income is recognised in the same accounting year.

Gains and losses on investments

Realised gains or losses are recognised when investments are sold.

Unrealised gains or losses are accounted for on revaluation of investments at 31 December.

Resources used

Grants

Grants and donations are accounted for when paid over, or when awarded, if that award creates a binding obligation on the PCC.

Activities directly relating to the work of the Church

The diocesan parish share is accounted for when due. Any parish share unpaid at 31 December is provided for in these financial statements as an operational (though not a legal) liability and is shown as a creditor in the balance sheet.

Fixed assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the financial statements by s.10(2)(a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

Movable church furnishings held by the vicar and churchwardens on special trust for the PCC and which require a faculty for disposal are accounted for as inalienable property unless consecrated. They are listed in the Church's inventory, which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to 2006 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore such assets are not valued in the financial statements. Items acquired since 1 January 2006 have been capitalised and depreciated in the financial statements over their currently anticipated useful economic life.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018

1 Accounting policies (continued)

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings (continued)

All expenditure incurred in the year on consecrated or beneficed buildings, individual items under £1,000 or on the repair of movable church furnishings acquired before 1 January 2006 is written off.

Other fixtures, fittings and office equipment

Equipment used within the church premises is depreciated on a straight-line basis over four years. Individual items of equipment with a purchase price of £1,000 or less are written off when the asset is acquired.

Investments

Investments are valued at market value at 31 December.

Current assets

Amounts owing to the PCC at 31 December in respect of fees, rents or other income are shown as debtors less provision for amounts that may prove uncollectable.

Short-term deposits include cash held on deposit either with the CBF Church of England Funds or at the bank.

11 Contingent Liability

The Church was closed for safety reasons from October 2017 to August 2018 following the fall of masonry from the underside of the nave ceiling. The ceiling repair began in 2017 and was completed in 2018 at a cost of $\mathfrak{L}_{122,389}$ (inc VAT). Unfortunately the dust from the ceiling repair had penetrated the organ pipes and, as a result, the organ has been out of use since the Church reopened. The estimated costs of the repairs to the pipe organ are of the order of $\mathfrak{L}_{100,000}$, although the PCC are hopeful part of the costs will be grant funded.

In the meantime the PCC has rented a digital organ, which is in use for weekly services.

12 Related Charity

The administration of the Church is undertaken from the Ranmoor Parish Centre at 5 Ranmoor Park Road, Sheffield S10 3GX. The Ranmoor Parish Centre Trust (charity No. 511649) is a related charity, its objects being the furtherance of the religious and other charitable work of the Church of England in the ecclesiastical parish of St John the Evangelist, Ranmoor in the Diocese and City of Sheffield. The Vicar, Churchwardens and representative members of the PCC are also Trustees of the Ranmoor Parish Centre Trust.

In the year the Parish Centre was paid £6,500 (2017 - £6,500) in respect of the Church's use of the facilities. There were no amounts outstanding at the beginning or end of the financial year.

13 Sale of Ranmoor Parish Hall

Funds from the sale of the Parish Hall, are held by the Ranmoor Church Hall Trust whose trustees are the vicar and churchwardens with the Diocesan Board of Finance acting as a custodian trustee. The Deposit fund stood at £241,052 at 31st December 2018 (2017 £319,678).

14 Agency Collections

During the year agency collections has been used to record sums received for other staff/organisations, eg. Wedding payments for organist, verger, bellringers, Diocese of Sheffield etc.
