This is the  $60^{th}$  year of the foundation of THE OLD PEOPLES WELFARE FOR ROCHFORD AND DISTRICT.

The committee was formed to provide facilities for the elderly of Rochford and District.

The Day Centre was built in the old Planning office before a purpose built building was erected in 1985 and extended in 1992.

The purpose of the building was to provide hot meals four days a week with social activities, warmth and friendship.

Our mini bus provides a door to door service enabling clients to visit the Doctors surgery, Dentist, chemist, post office, market and shops etc.

We will soon be taking delivery of a new mini bus which is much larger more comfortable and safer.

Most of the money has been provided by a client in memory of his wife. This we are very grateful for.

It has been a sad time at the Day Centre. First my husband David died last December he was my right hand for many years and Mary Shepherd who ran the Centre with her husband since 1990 and continued to carry on after Fred died and she ran the Bingo until she passed away January 2019.

We are grateful to our volunteers, our drivers: Mick, Ken and Kim.

Kim also helps in the kitchen and takes me to the cash and carry.

To Gerry who has helped in the kitchen for about 12 years. Margaret, Steff, Kay and my daughter Karen who has taken over the early shift from my husband. To Gill and Brian Plackett for their continuous commitment helping with all of our utility requirements.

We continue to fundraise for the centre with the presence of Father Christmas in his grotto at the Centre.

I am grateful for the help that we receive not only from the staff but also from the committee.

I am also grateful to Hilary our secretary and Mark our committee treasurer and Brenda.

I would also like to thank George our Day Centre Treasurer who at 91 years does sterling work. George also covers the work at the desk two days a week. Also thanks to our committee who continue to provide support throughout the year.
