Report of the trustees For the year ended 31 March 2019

The trustees present their report and the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2019. The trustees who served during the year and up to the date of this report are set out on page 1

Structure governance and management

Governing document

As from 1 April 2018 the Association has run as a CIO, charity number 117496 although the unincorporated charity 279975 is still open. Trustees hold monthly meetings and members have attended training in governance.

The Charity was governed by a constitution dated 15 April 1980 as amended 30 September 1980 and 8 March 1984. The charity had officially changed its name to Ilfracombe & District Community Transport Association and is so registered with the Charity Commission, HM Revenue and Customs and its bankers among others. The Association has had trustee indemnity insurance in place since the beginning of 2008.

Structure

The charity is an incorporated trust. To comply with Devon County Council requirements for the granting of contracts we began operating as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (Charity No 1174976) in April 2018. We have kept our charitable objectives, Trustees and other information the same as for Charity 279975 which we intend to keep as dormant.

Trustee selection

New trustees are voted in by the existing trustees. Additional trustees are actively being sought.

Objectives and activities

Objectives

The Constitution states that the object of the Association shall be to relieve persons who are handicapped, aged, blind or otherwise disabled by providing suitable and affordable transport which can, where necessary, be door-to-door.

Activities

We provide transport for the frail and disabled persons of all ages to enable them to attend hospital and other medical-related appointments, shopping trips, social outings, meeting and events etc. The charity is staffed by volunteers, apart from a Fleet Manager who is also a driver and it is a non-profitmaking organisation. Income is by means of a mileage charge for the use of the vehicles which goes towards the running costs, i.e. diesel, maintenance, insurance and administration. Any surplus funds are paid into a separate account towards the cost of replacing vehicles. The vehicles are available for those permitted to use them under Section 19 and section 22 permits within a 45-mile radius of Ilfracombe. They are also available for community groups and private hire when not already booked for our primary purpose.

Report of the Trustees For the year ended 31 March 2019

Personnel:

The Association has been a charity (unincorporated and incorporated) for 39 years and is run by 5 Trustees who decide policy and take part in the day-to-day operation of the minibus services. There is one full-time Fleet Manager, who also drives, responsible for the servicing and maintenance of the vehicles and oversees the 10 trained part-time drivers who can be called upon when need arises. We took on and trained one new part-time driver during the year. There was a change of the regular trained escort for a school contract and 2 more trained as escorts in addition to driving duties to be available in emergency. One of our passengers has volunteered to help as a booking co-ordinator and there is a part-time paid assistant who helps in administration. Fleet Manager has an input into policy, management meetings are open to all drivers and we welcome their contributions. The Trustees appreciate the support of all who help to make the Association run smoothly

Achievements and performance:

The year has continued to be a troubling and anxious one - and continues to be so - because the Government is seeking to implement European Regulation 1071/2009. This has resulted from a challenge by a small number of commercial bus operators that Section 19 and Section 22 permits give CTAs an unfair advantage when bidding against them for contract work. We have played a full part in lobbying our MPs in Torridge and North Devon, in completing reports for Mobility Matters, the national Community Transport Association and replying in full to the Government Consultation document. We have much support from MPs of all parties so are hopeful that we can continue to offer our services to the vulnerable people in our area. There is a Judicial Review coming up (no date yet), the Department for Transport has produced new guide-lines which threaten Community Transport work so we are still in a state of limbo unable to make plans for the future despite being told by the national CTA and Devon County Council to "carry on as usual".

In the meantime, we continue to run our regular minibus services under Section 19 permits – our Ring and Rides in North Devon and across Torridge, Passenger Clubs and Community Hire although we have curtailed our advertising, expanding services etc. until we know what the future holds. We have had to replace 3 minibuses which were beyond economical repair. The Town Bus service continues under our Section 22 permit and is getting well used. We have 8 minibuses and during the year we purchased an MPV which is used primarily to transport a partially sighted person on his business trips. The cost of repairs and servicing continues to be costly as regulations regarding frequency of safety inspection have been tightened.

Public benefit:

The Association has as its priority its charitable objectives and ensures that they are fully met. All our services are of community benefit and much appreciated by our passengers. Over the past year our fleet of minibuses drove passengers 11,060,664 miles, some 30 per cent of these journeys took passengers out from their homes to go shopping, also allowing them to socialise. This is especially important to those living in the isolated parts of Torridge in North Devon and for many of these their weekly trip on our minibus is the only way they can get their essentials and is a chance to speak to others. Mrs G who lives on an isolated farm in Huntshaw, among others, frequently expresses her gratitude and praises the driver for the help given. Our regular social outings operating from Ilfracombe and from Lynton allow passengers the chance to get out 'from their four walls' (as expressed by one regular traveler), to enjoy a meal in company and also to recall and talk of times past. We have transported some 45 local community groups to their activities and events, including scouts, brownies, walkers, runners, pensioners to luncheons and meetings, WI and other ladies' groups etc.

Fund-Raising:

One of our Trustees has responsibility for fund-raising. She aims to have one fund-raising activity per month, and this takes the form of raffles, quizzes, 60s disco nights and taking a stall at local community events for selling hand-knitted articles. Unfortunately, our Fund-raiser has not been in good health during this year but has still been able to organise these events and to raise much appreciated extra funds for us.

Reserves Policy:

Any surplus at the end of the year is allocated to a Government Investment Account towards the purchase of newer minibuses and, in addition, 3 months' average expenditure is kept in case the Association has to cease operating.

Serious Incidents:

The Trustees certify that there has been no serious incident to report.

1. Accounting policies

The principal accounting policies are summarised below. The accounting policies have been applied consistently throughout the year and the preceding period.

1.1. Basis of accounting

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention, except for the revaluation of certain fixed assets and except for investments which are included at market value, and in accordance with the statement of Recommended Practice 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities' issued in March 2005 (SORP 2005) and the Charities Act 1993.

1.2. Cashflow

The charity has taken advantage of the exemption in FRS102 from the requirement to produce a cashflow statement because it is a small charity.

1.3 Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specific purpose and which the charity may use for its purpose at its discretion

Designated funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor or through the terms of an appeal.

Endowment funds are retained intact and must not be spent.

1.4 Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when the charity is entitled to the income and the amount can be qualified with reasonable accuracy. The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income.

Voluntary income is received by way of grants, donations and gifts and is included in full in the statement of financial activities when receivable. Grants where entitlement is not conditional on the delivery of a specific performance by the charity are recognised when the charity becomes unconditionally entitled to the grant.

Donated services and facilities are included at the value to the charity where this can be qualified. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Gifts donated for resale are included as incoming resources within activities for generating funds when they are sold.

Grants, including grants for the purchase of fixed assets, are recognised in full in the statement of financial activities in the year in which they are receivable.

Income from investments is included in the year which it is receivable.

1.5 Resources expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accrual basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is reported as part of the expenditure to which it relates.

Costs of generating funds comprise the costs associated with attracting voluntary income and the costs of trading for fundraising purposes.

Charitable expenditure comprises those costs incurred by the charity in the delivery of its activities and services for its beneficiaries. It includes both costs that can be allocated directly such activities and those costs of an indirect nature necessary to support them.

Support costs are those costs incurred directly in support of expenditure on the objects of the charity and include project management.

1.6 Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost less residual value of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:
