The UK Trust in 2018

The Muktangan Educational Trust (the **UK Trust**) was founded in the UK in 2011 to support the work of Muktangan, an educational programme run by Paragon Charitable Trust in India. Muktangan provides high quality education to underprivileged children across seven English-medium schools and gives people from the community, especially women, a vocation through training them to be teachers. The UK Trust co-ordinates fundraising initiatives in the UK in order to support Muktangan's work in India.

The UK Trust comprises seven trustees who work remotely and on a voluntary basis. Trustee meetings are held in person four times per year with Skype meetings or conference calls in-between as required. Trustees are appointed for their passion for supporting the work of Muktangan in India and the skills and expertise that they are able to bring to the UK Trust. The UK Trust does not own any property and does not run an office. All of our trustees work remotely and give their time voluntarily.

Trustees receive no benefits from the charity but may claim reasonable expenses. Trustees have been appointed for differing lengths of time, to ensure that trustee appointments do not all come to an end at the same time. This will help ensure long-term stability for the UK Trust. During the year, we said goodbye to Laura Criddle and Kate Lewis, who stepped down as trustees, and Roy Montague-Jones took over as Chair of the trustees in succession to Abi Gill. We thank Laura and Kate very much for their invaluable contributions to the UK Trust, as well as Abi for guiding the UK Trust as Chair over the last three years and, for a further period before that, as Co-chair. We are fortunate that Abi is staying on with us as a trustee.

We also welcomed Patrick Montague-Jones and Aditi Surana on board as new trustees. Patrick and Aditi had both previously worked with the UK Trust as volunteers and, among other things, were the driving force behind the inaugural Five-a-Side football tournament we held in September, and our pub quiz in November.

Muktangan India

Vision

An inclusive, empowered world in which we all live in harmony with freedom of expression, respect and integrity.

Mission

To evolve sustainable, replicable, inclusive models of quality child-centred teacher education and school programmes in partnership with marginalised communities, and to implement them in the larger system.

Educational achievement at Muktangan

The Muktangan programme runs across seven English-medium public schools in Mumbai and caters to the individual needs of all students from pre-school up to 10th Standard (15-16 year olds). Muktangan was developed in response to the poor quality of mainstream education in India. Unlike mainstream education, Muktangan is characterised by small class sizes, low pupil-teacher ratios, and classrooms which harness creativity and individuality.

Muktangan's approach works. 2018 was the first year in which students from all seven Muktangan schools sat the Secondary School Certificate exams. Of the 222 Muktangan students who entered, including 23 with special educational needs, 99.5% passed (the average pass rate across all schools in Maharashtra was 86.4%). Added to this, 78% of Muktangan students scored a First Class (the average across Maharashtra schools was 53%). The top performers at Muktangan were Rosa, who scored an outstanding 96.8%, and Mamta, who achieved an extremely impressive 94.8%.

Academic success is just one component of the holistic, child-centred education that Muktangan provides, but these results are testament to the effectiveness of Muktangan's model, the dedication of Muktangan's staff, and a lot of hard work by the students.

Teacher training at Muktangan

Muktangan has an in-house teacher education programme in Mumbai that supports the development of people, mainly women, from the local community. Prospective teachers are invited to an assessment, with successful applicants being inducted into either the Foundation for Primary School programme or the Early Childhood Education for pre-school programme. They then complete a year of pre-service training, before entering the Muktangan schools to continue their training for a further two years.

Muktangan Education Resource Centre (MERC)

Muktangan's network of seven schools and its teacher education programme form the Muktangan Education Resource Centre (MERC), a consolidation of innovative pedagogical methods developed from over 15 years of action research. MERC is a space within which innovative leadership and teaching-learning approaches are tested and then incorporated into future teacher education programmes.

Muktangan has developed over 60 education-specific, capacity-building modules.

Three components of MERC

Integrated teacher and school education

Researching leadership and pedagogical learning

Outreach partnerships

Strengthening and contextualising the learning

Advocacy

Government, academic institutions, NGOs and policy makers



Muktangan's wider impact

Muktangan also undertakes outreach initiatives. These take shape through special projects and workshops designed to help roll out Muktangan's educational model and spread understanding of its benefits.

Examples of these initiatives include:

- the Active Constructive Oriented Teacher Education (ACOTE)
 project. This is a collaboration with the Maharashtra State
 Council for Education Research and Training, in which 10
 colleges providing courses leading to a Diploma in Elementary
 Education are taking part. The project aims to build the skills of
 education professionals for the ever-changing educational
 landscape and increasingly vocational environment of the 21st
 century.
- the Early Childhood Education Curriculum Enhancement and Pedagogy project, a joint initiative with the Singapore International Foundation, which aims to establish curriculum and assessment best practice in early childhood education. The project highlights the importance of early education as the foundation for future academic and social development, and brings together 240 early childhood education professionals from Muktangan schools and other education non-profits.
- Pedagogy Workshops, of which over 45 have been held since starting in early 2015, to share Muktangan's unique teaching principles and methods with external educators, including public and private schools and NGOs.

We returned to the historic London Canal Museum for our Annual Fundraising Dinner in May. The evening was once again a sell-out event, with delicious Indian food served. Muktangan's founders, Liz and Sunil Mehta, shared the latest news from Muktangan in India and the fantastic work by the staff throughout the Muktangan schools. The dinner was followed by an auction where the hotly-contested prizes included golf passes, afternoon tea at BT Tower, a number of pieces of artwork, and floristry lessons.

Second pub quiz

We returned to the Colonel Fawcett pub in Camden in November for the second Muktangan Pub Quiz and a great evening of brain-teasing trivia. The 'Back to School' round was a particular favourite as the teams had to roll back the years and dig deep for knowledge most of them hadn't touched for many years. The evening, which included a raffle with prizes including an experiencedays.com voucher and artwork by Muktangan students, raised more indispensable funds to support the work of Muktangan.

Annual Christmas card sale

Once again, we held our annual Christmas card sale, with 5 new cards designed by Muktangan students.

We had four runners running for Muktangan in the 2018 Royal Parks Half Marathon in October. Our sterling team battled through Hyde Park, Green Park, St James's Park and Kensington Gardens in the wind and rain to secure a great result for Muktangan.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Muktangan Educational Trust I report on the accounts of the Trust for the year ended 30 December 2018, which are set out herewith.

Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts.
