Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 March 2019

The Trustees have pleasure in submitting their report and the financial statements of the Trust for the year ended 31 March 2019.

Reference and Administrative Details

Ukraine Christian Ministries is a registered Charity, No. 1061221. The operating address of the charity is: Flat 5, 7 Tivoli Court, 64a Surrey Road, Bournemouth, Dorset, BH4 9HU.

On 1st January 2019, Rev JD Hendy stood down as the Chief Executive Officer of the charity and was succeeded in that position by Miss Ella Bewsey to whom day to day management of the charity is delegated by the trustees.

Structure, Governance and Management

The Trust is an unincorporated association governed by its Trust Deed, and administered by its Trustees. New trustees are appointed from time to time by the vote of the existing trustees.

The Charity's Objects and Activities

The Charity's aims are to promote the advancement of the Christian religion or the material assistance of the poor or the advancement of education in the country of Ukraine (and other countries of the world as opportunities may arise), by conducting seminars with local pastors and assisting them with church-planting and mission work, and the provision of relief supplies.

Achievements & Performance

We have seen another fruitful year in the work of UCM. The building of the church in the village of Denghi has made huge progress and the church there are now meeting regularly as well as running camps with the young people. Three young men from the village have given their lives to Christ and are currently preparing for baptism this summer. The whole church family is delighted to have a proper church building to meet in and host events.

Across the villages camps were run over the summer, with some 500 children attending and hearing the gospel. This year smaller camps have also taken place during the winter and spring school holidays, enabling the young people to hear more about Jesus. At Christmas time the team from the village of Blagodatne visited 7 of the local churches and nursery schools, sharing the Christmas message to the children and presenting them each with a gift. The children are so full of joy to have this celebration.

UCM also took a small group of volunteers out to partner with Camp Maximum in Zolotonosha where they served on the team for a teenage adventure camp. The relationship with Camp Maximum is continually strengthening and UCM has been able to take volunteers to share their expertise and teach the Ukrainian team how to cater for children with physical and learning disabilities. We pray that this link will continue to grow.

Three of our village pastors began further training in the seminary at Kreminchuk, while two of the younger church members completed their study and have taken on the role of youth pastors in the village of Balgodatne. We were also able to welcome two more men as deacons to serve in the local churches supporting the pastors.

Finally we have been able to support a number of individuals with significant medical care and practical provision of the most basic needs.

We praise God for the many willing servants He has put in place in the region and thank Him for the gifts from our supporters that allow us to resource much of the work that they do.

Public Benefit

In carrying out its activities in the year under review, the trustees have had regard to the public benefit guidance issued by the Charity Commission, and are satisfied that the activities mentioned above have all been for the public benefit.

Financial Review

The Trust operated at a surplus in the year under review, of $\pounds 25,706$. The trustees consider that the overall financial state of affairs of the Trust is satisfactory.

The Trustees regularly review the reserves of the charity to ensure that sufficient liquid funds are available for the Trust to meet its ongoing obligations. The policy is to hold sufficient reserves to enable the charity to meet its ongoing commitments and obligations.

Notes to the Accounts for the Year ended 31 March 2019

1. Accounting Policies

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material in relation to the Charity's Financial Statements.

(a) Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Charities Statement of Recommended Practice: "Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)"; and with applicable regulations.

(b) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy. For legacies, entitlement is the earlier of the charity being notified of an impending distribution or the legacy being received.

(c) Tangible Fixed Assets and Depreciation

Tangible fixed assets costing more than £250 are capitalised and included at cost less accumulated depreciation. Depreciation is provided on all such assets on a reducing balance basis, in order to write them off over their expected useful lives at the following annual rates:
