Respective responsibilities of the Council and examiner

Basis of independent examiner's report

My examination was carried out in accordance with the General Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a "true and fair view" and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement

I have completed my examination. I confirm that no material matters have come to my attention in connection with the examination giving me cause to believe that in any material respect:

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

The Council present their annual report for the year ended 31 December 2018 under the Charities Act 2011, together with the financial statements for the year, and confirm that the latter comply with the requirements of the Act, the Trust Deed and the Charities SORP 2005.

Structure, Governance and Management

Organisation

The Parochial Church Council of St John the Divine with St James the Apostle Kennington registered as a charity with the Charities Commission in England and Wales on 30th December 2015. The registered charity number is 1164999.

The Church is governed by the Parochial Church Council.

Members of the Council are:

The Parochial Church Council has appointed a Treasurer and Secretary from its number. The Treasurer for 2017 was Mr Mark Dickinson and the Secretary, Mr Nicholas Hodgson. The Incumbent is the Chairman of the Council, and the Council appointed Ms Venessa Denny, Churchwarden, as Vice-Chairman of the Council. The Council reserves the right to co-opt members who might have a particular contribution to make.

The Council meets six times a year, and delegates some business to Finance, Pastoral, Social and Buildings sub-committees. The standing Committee of the Council comprises the Incumbent, Treasurer, Secretary and Churchwardens, and meets as necessary.

Risk policy

The Council has examined the major strategic, business and operational risks which the charity faces and confirm that systems have been established to enable regular reports to be produced so that the necessary steps can be taken to lessen these risks.

REPORT OF THE COUNCIL (Continued)

Objectives and activities

The objects of the Council are the furtherance of the mission and ministry of the Church of England in the Benefice of St John the Divine with St James the Apostle, Kennington, including within the Parish schools, St John the Divine Primary School and Saint Gabriel's College.

The Council has paid due regard to guidance issued by the Charities Commission in deciding what activities the charity should undertake.

Achievements and performance

During the year the PCC has continued to develop its work with children and young people, most notably through music, but also in supporting the parish schools. Ministry amongst teenagers has been strengthened with a new weekly group, the extension of the activities of the Consort choir which now has an annual residential course, and a mentoring project in the planning. Involvement with the community organising network Citizens UK has continued to be an important vehicle through which the parish works with other institutions for the improvement of society, whilst the lunch and exercise club for the elderly and Robes project for rough sleepers continue to extend their work. Providing accessible facilities for the community that are fit for purpose is a priority for the PCC, which looks forward to ongoing conversations with significant partners bearing fruit in the near future.

Financial review

Net outgoing resources for the year were £44,313 (2017: £13,410 incoming). In addition, during the year the market value of investments increased by £484 (2017: £8,540). No investments were sold (2017: £0). Extraordinary planning costs were incurred for the ongoing hall development project for professional services related to project management, legal and architectural services of £82,529 (2017: £60,873). Extraordinary income of £26,000 was received from rent on the Curate's house, and funds raised but not yet spent on the Saint Gabriel's College Chapel. No legacy income was received (2017: £23,308).

Reserves policy

It is the policy of the charity to maintain unrestricted funds, which are the free reserves of the charity, at a level which equates to approximately six months unrestricted expenditure. This provides sufficient funds to cover management and administration and support costs and to respond to emergency applications for grants which arise from time to time. Unrestricted funds were maintained at this level throughout the year.

Plans for future periods

With the encouragement of the Diocese of Southwark the parish has continued to work with an architect and project manager to explore the possibilities around providing new community centre facilities that are fit for purpose and will serve the growing need of the church and community. A partnership has been established and a working relationship developed. Funds have been committed to take this forward with the expectation that the bulk of costs will be for the parish's own legal counsel as the development partner is likely to take on the most other costs. As such estimated costs incurred during 2019 will be significantly less assuming the project scope remains broadly static. The aspiration continues to be provision of new centre facilities and increased accessibility to the grade I listed church building as well as securing the musical mission of the parish and enhanced community engagement.

A stewardship campaign conducted in Q1 2019 has yielded increase pledged giving for 2019, and a 'wish list' established to solicit funds for non-budgeted items from the congregation.

Accounting and reporting responsibilities

The trustees are responsible for preparing the Trustees' Annual Report and the financial statements in accordance with applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

The law applicable to charities in England and Wales requires the trustees to prepare financial statements for each financial year which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the charity and of the incoming resources and application of resources of the charity for that period. In preparing these financial statements, the trustees are required to:

- select suitable accounting policies and apply them consistently;
- observe the methods and principles in the Charities SORP 2015 (FRS102);
- make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent

- state whether applicable accounting standards have been followed, subject to any material departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements;
- prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

1. Accounting policies

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Bulletin 1 published on 2 February 2016), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS102), the Charities Act 2011 and UK Generally Accepted Practice as it applies from 1 January 2015.

The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.

The financial statements are prepared on a going concern basis under the historical convention (modified to include certain items at fair value). The financial statements are presented in sterling which is the functional currency of the charity and rounded to the nearest pound.

The significant accounting policies applied in the preparation of these financial statements are set out below. These policies have been consistently applied to all years unless otherwise stated.

Incoming resources

All incoming resources are included in the SOFA when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

Resources expended

All expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with use of the resources.

Tangible fixed assets and depreciation

Tangible fixed assets are stated at estimated historic cost less depreciation. No depreciation is provided due to the Council's opinion that the estimate of historic cost is significantly below current market value.

Fund accounting

General funds are unrestricted funds which are available for use at the discretion of the trustees for particular purposes. The aim and use of each designated fund is set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Restricted funds are funds which are to be used in accordance with specific restrictions imposed by donors or which have been raised by the charity for particular purposes. The cost of raising and administering such funds are charged against the specific fund. The aim and use of each restricted fund as set out in the notes to the financial statements.

Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value.
