TRUSTEES ANNUAL REPORT

Structure of Trust

The Constitution for the Unincorporated Association of Charitable Purpose, known as The Butterfly Garden was adopted on 14 April 2009.

The Butterfly Garden is managed and administered by a committee of officers and members which is collectively know as "the Trustees". Trustees retire with effect from the conclusion of the 4th annual general meeting after his or her appointment but shall be eligible for re-election at that annual general meeting.

All trustees give their time voluntarily and receive no remuneration or benefits.

Objectives

- 1 To benefit individuals or groups dealing with disadvantage or disablement, with a particular emphasis on supporting the needs of people with learning and behavioural problems.
- 2 To provide or assist in the provision of facilities in the interests of social welfare for recreation or other leisure time occupation of individuals who have need of such facilities by reason of their youth, age, infirmity or disability, financial hardship or social circumstances with the object of improving their conditions of life.
- 3 To promote social inclusion for the public benefit and to relieve the needs of those already socially excluded, assisting them to reintegrate into society for the purpose of this clause "socially excluded" means being excluded from society as a result of one or more of the following factors: unemployment; financial hardship; youth or old age; ill health (physical or mental); substance abuse or dependency including alcohol and drugs; discrimination on the grounds of sex, race, disability, ehtnic origin, religion, belief, creed, sexual orientation or gender reassignment; poor educational skills attainment; relationship and family breakdown; poor housing (that is housing that does not meet basic habitable standards); crime (either as a victim of crime, or as an offender rehabilitating into society).

CHAIRMAN'S REPORT 2018

Incredibly we find ourselves at the end of another year and we continue to grow. We are still seeing all of our regular users, but new connections have formed on a daily basis and we continued to host gatherings for and with the wider community.

Our commitment is to an integration with community and acceptance of all, is a priority. As an endorsement to this we worked in support of others, most notably the Sue Ryder Hospice and the MacMillan Cancer Care nurses. We are now working closely with the NHS, educators, families and Social Services to enhance our worth. Access to the site has been improved following the donation of a mini bus and across the week we now shuttle students in from bus stops that are a mile away.

We have once more seen a terrific amount of fundraising carried out on our behalf and have continued to invest in the improvement of resources and the creation of social opportunity. There have been many parties and outings.

There has also been an enrichment of our activities with stronger commitment to drama, art and craft, and most notably to music (we have started a music club) and cookery. The increased interest in cookery has highlighted a need for more space and so, (having secured planning permission) we are building a proper catering kitchen, which will open before Christmas. All areas of the site are busy, and we are not seeing many quiet times. A year on, the Art Room is very lively, and we are seeing activity there everyday and have successfully safeguarded its total dedication to art. As a spin-off from this commitment and using the student's work, we ran an art exhibition in Cheltenham earlier in the year (and have been invited by the gallery owner, to repeat the event in 2019). This autumn we are running an arts week at the site, with a wide range of practitioners offering new experiences to our students.

The extra fundraising has also allowed us to buy in sub contract teachers to reliably deliver some of these.

Our limited company 'The Butterfly Garden Shop' continues to do well and this autumn looks likely to be used as a retail training space for S.E.N students.

And so, to the thank-you's. The commitment of students, volunteers, family, friends and community is and has been quite extraordinary. I thank all of you for your trust and belief in our work.

Financial Review

As at 31 December 2018 the Charity held funds of £62,880 (2017: £59,723).

Funds raised during the year from donations, fund raising activities and gift aid tax were £68,970 (2017: £80,726).

There were no grants received in the year (2017: £9,212).

During the year, building work commenced on the new kitchen 'Dorothy's' and expenditure up to 31 December 2018 amounted to £26,180.

A total of £3,216 (2017: £1,947) was spent on other facilities.

A total of £10,384 (2017: £2,376) was spent on training and learning.
