Making disciples for Jesus



Mablethorpe Christian fellowship held weekly worship services on Sundays at Hope House, the Churches home base. The only time these did not take place was for one week of snow in March and when the Church attended the 'ONE' Christian celebration in August. Our services included a weekly kids club for children aged 4-14 and a crèche facility.

Our services were normally published to our Facebook page so that members can keep up to date with teaching when they cannot attend meetings.

As well as Sunday meetings we also held regular mid week fellowship groups. Our Open House also operated Tuesdays –Fridays throughout the year allowing those who want friendship or support a place to meet.

We also provided 2 houses to support those who are homeless or in housing crisis (total of 8 beds)

Open House

Open House operates Tuesday to Friday, 10.00AM to 2.00PM. Open House provides a place to meet for friendship, support, and refreshments. We provide free drinks and low cost meals (free to those in need) The Open House has increasingly been used as a base to support those who needing help with benefits or who are homeless. For those needing benefit support, there is a regular visit from the DWP. We also provide help with forms or internet / phone contact for people doing Universal Credit applications. For the homeless, we can provide support with contacting homeless officers, washing facilities, clothing, showers, meals, free use of the phone and internet for benefit claims. We also have 2 houses providing accommodation with support for men facing homelessness. This is covered elsewhere in this report.

Our team can also signpost people for other support including the Furnichurch food larder and access to financial / debt advice.

The small team of volunteers is led by Lisa Collins. Lisa's post has been largely funded by a grant from The East Coast Community Fund provided by Ørsted which provides 80% of her salary over 2 years. The trustees of MCF are very grateful for this financial support which is a great help.

The group has seen consistent numbers of children and carers attending every week. A wide range of toys and activities are available each week.

The group enjoyed a day out at Sundown Park.

The group also organised a charity fundraiser in the form of a sponsored toddle along the promenade....those ho made it were rewarded with an ice cream at the end. £394.50 was raised for Barnardo's which was a very good result...congratulations to all involved.

Church Life

We held Sunday morning services at Hope House every week throughout the year (except August Bank holiday weekend when the church was at the ONE Event Christian Celebration) Services consist of worship provided by a small but dedicated team, teaching from the bible, fellowship and prayer. Once a month we also have communion. We also held Children's club meetings alongside the main meeting. We included a Church lunch every month following the morning service. Numbers attending on a Sunday have been down compared to previous years with average attendance between 40 -45.

We also operate a Facebook page which we use to broadcast the weeks teaching programme as well as use for general Church information.

Our teaching themes during the year have been The book of Acts (January to August) and Lessons from 30 years of Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship (September) We ceased to meet as Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship from the end of September when we restructured as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO) and also took the opportunity to rename as Hope House Church—Mablethorpe.

We have a weekly prayer meeting on a Monday morning to ensure we start the week and commit our ways to the Lord in prayer.

We held 2 mid week house fellowship meetings throughout the year. These met on Wednesday evenings and Thursday mornings. The teaching used in the house fellowship meetings follows on from the teaching on a Sunday morning.

We attended the ONE Event Christian Celebration organised by Ground level over the August bank holiday weekend. We had a round 20 people camping for the whole weekend and a around the same number visiting throughout the weekend as day visitors.

We have also hosted 3 international ministries during the year, either directly or working with other Churches to deliver meetings across the area.



Churches Together



Working with Churches Together, we helped with the Open The book which was delivered into 2 local primary schools every term week throughout the year by 2 dedicated teams of workers. Our own Families and community worker, Judy Collins was responsible for overseeing the teams and was actively involved herself.

As well as visiting the schools, the Open the Book teams also did an aster Special event and a light party for Halloween. These were all very well attended by children from the schools.

Churches Together also organised their first 'Holiday at home' week. This was aimed at elderly house bound people and provided a day of activities and lunch over a week. The first event had 22 people attending, most came every day and it was considered a great success and thoroughly enjoyed by all who attended.

Churches Together also organised a prayer gathering to start the year and a sponsored walk to raised funds for the community activities they had planned.

Churches Together also provided a representative to the management committee for our homeless accommodation, the local rector Peter Liley took up the post.

Transitioning to become Hope House Church

Throughout this year our leadership have been preparing for Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship to become a Charitable Incorporated organisation (CIO), a relatively new form of charity. We took the opportunity to launch with a new name, Hope House Church—Mablethorpe

In early January 2018, the Charity Commission accepted our application to establish a new CIO as such, having taken legal advice we planned to operate under our new name from September 2018. However, problems with the legal process of transferring our Churches property to the new organisation meant the launch date was delayed until 1st October 2018.



We transferred the Church operations and most assets to Hope House Church from 1st October 2018, including all employment contracts. There was however an ongoing legal delay with the property but this was completed during October.

One outstanding problem has been with transferring the Churches mini bus which was supplied with a grant from the Department for Transport(Dft) The Dft would not allow the vehicle to be transferred until it was 3 year old and despite the assistance of our local MP's office, they would not change their view. As such our trustees took the reluctant decision to keep the bus operating under Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship until April 2019 when it will be 3 years old.

Practically speaking it means that the activities of Mablethorpe Christian fellowship ceased at the end of October and as such this report only covers the Church activities until that time. From 1st October 2018, our activities are covered by the new CIO Hope House Church—Mablethorpe.



Ground level Network

We are members of the ground level network of Churches which provide support and training to Churches across the UK.

Our leadership have benefitted from monthly leaders meetings at Lincoln, quarterly key leaders days at Retford and from the Ground level leaders conference at Swanwick. Our Open House manger, has also completed the GL Leadership Engine training which was financially supported by the Church.

As a church we have also benefitted from attending the ONE celebration on the Lincoln showground.

Our Church leader has served on the Ground level Executive team and acted as a trustee of GL throughout the year.



Hope House Homes



One of our major projects during 2018 has been the development of two Hope House Homes to help those facing housing crisis.

In September 2017, we began managing a house of multiple occupation in the town (HMO) which the owner kindly made available to us to house men facing housing crisis. We provide a support worker for this house and the home has assisted....men throughout 2018.

We also put in a planning application to change the use of a seasonal holiday accommodation we have at Hope House to convert to an all year round supported living accommodation for those in housing crisis. Despite some local objection the application was passed in January 2018. However there was a condition that we had to obtain an approved management plan prior to opening. This proved challenging and involved many hours of work for both the support worker Claire, Open House manager and church pastor. The plan was approved in June 2018. We also invited the housing standards team to inspect the accommodation prior to opening and although their requested alterations were minor, they proved more complicated than expected to complete. As such we did not open the accommodation until September 2018. The accommodation will house 4 men and along with the 4 beds at a separate property we can provide 8 beds with support.

The house support worker has had her salary initially paid by a grant from the Coastal community challenge fund(6 months which covered till March 2018) and for a further 1 year by a grant from the bishop Of Lincolns Social Justice Fund. The trustees are very grateful for this support which has enabled us to start this major work. We also received £300 from Churches Together to help with rent shortfall at the separate property while it was only partly occupied.

Initial signs are that the support at the house is proving very helpful for a number of the men who have come to us for support.

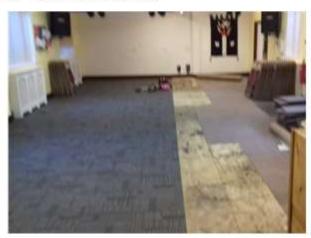
News in brief:

It was great to have these young and gifted people with us

We once again held a Harvest service to collect much needed food supplies for the Furnichurch food larder. Peoples generosity meant that a good amount of food was once again given.

Community bus

Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship operate a community bus to benefit the Church and local community groups.

We provide a team of volunteer drivers who are now well established and have, between them been able to provide the drivers for all the community groups that have needed the use of he bus during the year.

We provide the service to three Churches, a local college, and a number of other local community groups.

We had planned to transfer the bus from Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship to our new organisation Hope House Church but the Department for transport refused to endorse our request, despite the assistance of our local MP's office. As such, we have had to keep Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship operating, purely in order to operate the bus, until the bus reaches its third year of operation in April 2019.



Visiting ministries.

Public benefit:

As a Church with a **community focus**, our public benefit can be clearly seen. We provided:

Morning service every week. Our morning service is modern and one of few services in the area that will appeal to those who have no Church background. We also provide a crèche and children's work

Open House 4 days a week to anyone who needs help, support, friendship or a meal (and provided free of charge to anybody who cannot afford to make a contribution). The Open house team have worked closely with other community workers to assist local people in need. We work with a growing number of homeless and people who are struggling with addictions.

For children and youth we provide

Glow-worms mums and toddlers provides support and help to local carers and families.

We manage and operate a **Community bus** that provides support to a number of local community groups.

We administer a **homeless fund** that provides help and support to local homeless people. We manage a house providing **supported living** for up to 4 homeless men

A holiday at home club, ran in conjunction with Churches Together, providing a weeks activities for 20 plus people who are housebound.

MABLETHORPE CHRISTIAN FELLOWSHIP ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDING 31st DECEMBER 2018

2018 a year of transition - note to readers of the attached accounts

Early in 2017 the trustees of Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship (an unincorporated charity founded by a Delaration of Trust dated 23rd June 2003) began to examine the benefits of transferring the activities of the charity to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation.

More recently the Fellowship had aquired a property in Victoria Road (Hope House) which was used as a place of worship and increasingly for community outreach activities

In addition, the trustees were exploring the possibility of providing supported accommodation for people in crisis or homeless through use of the upper floor, use of which was barred by a planning restriction over the winter months. Also the trustees were considering renting (with a view to taking a lease) a further property for use as supported housing.

The Department for Transport had provided a Community Bus - a 16 seater minibus for community use which was also managed by the charity.

Given these changes, the trustees felt it apprpriate that a new consitution be drawn up.

It was decided to register a new Charitable Incorporated Organisation to be known as **Hope House Church - Mablethorpe.**

A legal document provides for the transfer of the assets and liabilities of Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship to Hope House Church - Mablethorpe with effect from 1st October 2018.

Due to a condition imposed by the Department for Transport the community bus was not transferred until April 2019.

With the exception of the community bus therefore the respective accounts of Mablethorpe Chistian Fellowship and Hope House Church show the following:

Mablethorpe Christian Fellowship: transactions January to September Hope House Church - Mablethorpe: transactions October to December

A document (for information only) included as an an appendix provides an overview of the year 2018 as a whole and enables meaningful comparison with the prior year.
