This amounts to an average weekly donation of approximately 80 hours.</p> <p>All the Trustees live and are based in the UK however, the Trustees have an authorised representative, Peterson Githinji, the Head-teacher of St. Paul's School in Nakuru, Kenya, who also serves as the Operations Director (approximately 20 hours per week).</p>

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity, identifying the difference the charity's work has made to the circumstances of its beneficiaries and any wider benefits to society as a whole.	Para 1.20	<p>2018-19 was a busy year starting in April with a <u>Trustee visit</u> to Kenya to develop partnerships with government and local community representatives of a second school (Mukinyai Primary School).</p> <p>A <u>workshop</u> was held in Nakuru in March 2018 with stakeholder representatives where cultural barriers to partnership were identified and addressed.</p> <p>In partnership with the local community <u>mains water was connected</u> to the school even though the supply is severely restricted. Having seen commitment from the community to do practical work, we provided water harvesting facilities to enable 80,000 litres of water to be stored and used for drinking, hand-washing and cooking at the school.</p> <p>Further commitment to partnership was shown by the community through joining <u>training groups</u> which enabled us to build the kitchen and store for the school.</p> <p>At the beginning of December the first <u>school meals</u> were cooked for around 160 children and parents as a taster and demonstration of what would start in January 2019. School meals were provided by FF every school day beginning 2nd January 2019.</p> <p>Groups of parents and other community members were taught basic <u>conservation agriculture</u> and more parents encouraged to join the groups.</p>

Achievements against objectives set	Para 1.41	The main objectives for 2018-19 was to develop and work in partnership with the Mukinyai Community, to build a kitchen block and provide school meals. These objectives were fully achieved.

Although the fundraising target was not reached, Trustees do not consider this to be of major concern as the extra funds raised were allocated in the budget for a future project.

The Charity is in the process of developing relationships with local Government and university departments in Kenya, as well as NGOs working in the area. (Nakuru County Ministries of Education, Agriculture, Egerton University, Rotary Club, Compassion International, Ekenywa (water NGO)

Relationship with any related parties	Para 1.51	<p>The Charity carries out its work through Lisha Jamii, a newly registered Society (NGO) in Kenya (2018). Two of the Charity's Trustees are also Trustees of Lisha Jamii.</p> <p>The Charity works with beneficiaries through a formalised partnership. During a governance visit in December the Memorandum of Understanding with the Mukinyai Primary School and the local Community through the Chief was reviewed in preparation for signature once the new head teacher was appointed. The new head started in January 2019 and discussions with the community enabled real changes to be made. Trustees confirm there have been no serious incidents to report to the Charity Commission.</p> <p>During the year Feeding Futures has had a student from the BA Charity Development course at Chichester University working as an intern. It is hoped that this will be a mutually beneficial experience over the next year.</p> <p>General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR)</p> <p>The trustees have continued to use MailChimp for communication with supporters. This platform provides the opportunity for supporters to UNSUBSCRIBE. Along with GDPR, the Privacy, Cookies and Complaints policies have been reviewed along with the subscription.</p> <p>Safeguarding arrangements</p> <p>The safeguarding policy and flowchart for staff and volunteers in Kenya was completed and implemented during the year. This is on public display at the school where we work.</p> <p>Staff appointments</p> <p>There have been no new staff appointed this year. We are grateful that the current staff in Kenya have proven to be excellent workers and make a huge contribution to the partnership. The Operations Director in Kenya who has been working on a voluntary basis for eight years has this year been given a stipend to recognise his significant contribution towards the work.</p>
