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## Report of the Trustees for the year ended 31 March 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 March 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

#### **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

#### Objectives and aims

The objectives and aims of the Society are to promote and advance discussion groups using the Balint method, and research and studies on the psychological aspects of health and social care, with special reference to the professional-patient/client relationship and to disseminate this knowledge beyond the Society for the improvement of the care of the public at large.

## **Policies to further objectives**

To provide an opportunity for the study of similar problems as experienced by members of branches of other helping professions and in this connection to support and promote Balint Groups of the type already established in this country and elsewhere;

To promote the publication of the transactions of the society and of the relevant material;

To establish relationships with similar charitable societies;

To assist any charitable body or bodies financially or otherwise;

To obtain, collect and receive money and funds by way of contributions, donations, affiliations, subscriptions, legacies, grants and other lawful methods and to accept and receive gifts of property of any description (whether subject to any special trusts or not).

## ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE Charitable activities Secretary's Report on Achievement & Performance for the year ended 31 March 2018

The Council has continued to bring the Society up to date with its IT presence.

Ceri Dornan and Eamonn Marshall co-produced a General Data Protection Policy and Data Breach Policy to make sure the Society complied with the new regulations that came into force late in March of this year. Eamonn is investigating the viability of a mapping service for leaders and current groups across the country. We have been able to set up a Direct debit system, including payment in Euros, for membership and events using Go-Cardless.

A review by Council of the last year's accounts showed a deficit of income over expenses of £5,000. This had not happened in previous years. There has been an increase in the number of events in the year, some of which have run at a loss. Because Council wanted to continue to support leaders in their work at events and to continue subsidies (to students and non-medical professionals) it was decided to increase the membership fee and the cost of attending events. This was the first increase in many years. We hope the members support this initiative in encouraging Balint work.

The Annual Dinner and study day had Professor Helen Stokes-Lampard PHD, the current Chair of the Royal Collage of General Practitioners (RCGP), as speaker. There was a lively discussion from society members on the wish for greater encouragement from the college for psychodynamic thinking and reflection of practitioners in their medical work. With this in mind the Society wishes to strengthen its affiliation with the college. The RCGP has agreed to endorse the Balint Society events and asked the Society to present a workshop at the annual conference in Glasgow in October.

Eamonn Marshall and Helen Sheldon are hoping to continue Balint groups for those medical students who have had Balint Group experience as undergraduates in London. There is to be an open day in October to formulate the next steps. There are encouraging indications that more Medical Schools are giving their undergraduates exposure to Balint work.

The Balint Society UK continues its links with the International Balint Federation. Some members abroad are members of the UK Society as a way of promoting Balint Groups and the formation of local societies in those countries. Their contribution to thinking about Balint work is always welcome.

## Report on the International Balint Federation (IBF) Congress held in Oxford, 6th to 10th September 2017

The UK Balint Society was host for the biennial IBF Congress in 2017. National Balint Societies volunteer to host this meeting, with the UK last having done so in 1998. The Congress required two years of careful preparation, finding a suitable venue and preparing a programme. The theme of our meeting was 'Balint Theory and Practice: Exploring Diversity'. The programme included talks, presented papers and workshops around the conference theme. Participants also took part in Balint groups or leadership training groups throughout the weekend. A day was also arranged to allow medical students from the UK to attend, to hear talks including presentations from the 3 winners of an international essay prize and have their own Balint group.

We were pleased to have a large attendance of 212 people from around 26 countries. Feedback about the meeting was very positive and we felt that our links with the international Balint community had been strengthened.

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## Notes to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 March 2018

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception of investments which are included at market value, as modified by the revaluation of certain assets.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

## **Expenditure**

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

#### **Taxation**

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

### **Fund accounting**

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.
