The charity promotes and supports the Christian Life Community as a way of life both for existing members and for those who are interested in becoming members, and provides suitable opportunities and materials to this end.

It assists individual members and groups to grow in an appreciation of the Christian Life Community way of life and in their mission for the glory of God and the common good, and to deepen their experience of Ignatian spirituality, providing support, training and formation at national and regional levels.

It maintains and strengthens links with European and worldwide Christian Life Communities and fosters links at a national level in England and Wales.

It responds to issues such as the dignity of the person, the welfare of families, and deprivation or social justice, either in this country or in the wider international community as may be discerned by the national Christian Life Community.

Section D Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

During 2018 in the regions and clusters members organised Regional Days, retreats, Days of Reflection, Quiet Days, and sessions to attract new members.

In London there is a cluster of 13 groups, of which most meet at Farm Street and more than half of the members are younger adults. Activities include Information Evenings, Masses and walks.

Three delegates were commissioned to represent us at the Christian Life Community World Assembly held near Buenos Aires in Argentina. The assembly re confirmed the priorities identified 5 yearse arlier including ecology, youth, family and globalization and poverty. The theme was "Deepen, Share and Go Forth."

At the World Assembly, Latvia, which had been sponsored by Christian Life Community in England and Wales during its 5 year period of Formation, was welcomed into the World Community alongside Mauritius and Vietnam.

We now have four Regional Representatives in post covering North West, Midlands, London & South East and South West which are areas where most members are concentrated.

Euro Link role was re-established in order to strengthen our links with European countries, both inside and outside the EU.

Family Network has been working on ideas inspired by the priority which World and European CLC has given to the family.

The National Formation and Retreat Team worked on reviewing our literature and held a formation experience specifically for the National Team (Trustees).

The charity has continued to maintain and strengthen its links with the National Board of Catholic Women and the National Council of Lay Associations.
