January

During the month of January the group opened the winter hours 11am till 3pm, Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday to the public. The watering was done when required.

The volunteers working, Ashley Walters, Richard Newnham, Micheal Clements, Sylvia Ferguson, Alice Finnimore and Mary salter we took cuttings and opened to public.

February

Still opening winter hours, deep clean of the building and cuttings taken. A visit from the CEO of Wolverhampton city council Mr K Ireland with the Mayor and other council officials to do a walk around and discuss the future of the conservatory. Had permission to start work in woodland area at back of conservatory.

March

Still opening winter hours and watering when required did some cuttings and general work in conservatory. Worked outside with Gary Price Ranger Tom and the rest of Friends of West Park team clearing the woodland area of weeds and rubbish and trimming trees back.

April

May

Altered the opening times to summer times. Thursday – Sunday 10 – 4pm and watering when required. Had the green flag visit on the 15 May all went well and park was awarded the Green Flag award.

June

October

November

December

We opened on the run up to christmas and maintenance was carried out on plants and displays and general cleaning. We did close for a period over the holidays but watering was still done as required throughout this time.
