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Report of the Trustees for the Year Ended 31 December 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

The principal objective of the charity throughout the current and previous years has been the raising of funds to enable disadvantaged young people to attend Christian camps, and to enable training to be provided for outdoor activity leaders.

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

The charity has continued to support those who have been assessed as most able to benefit from camps, training courses and other Christian activities held in an outdoor environment.

The trustees operated a bursary fund, administered by the secretary, to enable young people to participate in beneficial outdoor activity programmes. During 2018 a total of 50 (2017: 48) grants were provided totalling £10,174 (2017: £7,177):

CYE events - 7 grants with total value of £1,116 School visits - 34 grants with total value of £8,710 Church group visits - 9 grants with total value of £348

These applications are approved by a trustee delegated from the board.

The Secretary of the trust has additionally been able to support the objects of the charity as follows:

- Giving regular management, advisory and fundraising support to CYE Sailing Centre
- Leading a number of Christian Outdoor activity events in association with CYE Sailing Centre
- Planning European content and liaising with European delegates regarding Christian Camping conferences in 2018
- Attending & leading sessions at UK Christian Camping International (CCI) conference in January 2018
- Visits to Albania, France & Poland, supporting, establishing and advising networks of Christian Camping leaders, and contributing to their conferences
- Norman Doney organised a inaugural CCI European conference in October 2018 with representatives from Albania, France, Netherlands, Romania, Spain, France, Poland, Hungary, Russia and Ukraine to be held at the Scripture Union Centre in Alsace, France.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

The results for the year are set out in the annexed Statement of Financial Activities.

FUTURE PLANS

The charity intends to continue to carry out its present objectives for the foreseeable future. Future plans within the next three years include visits to Hungary to establish a network, France, Netherlands, Romania, Russia, Albania and Spain.

In 2020, attendance will be required at the CCI worldwide summit in Australia.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity is controlled by its governing document, a trust deed dated 1 September 1983 and constitutes an unincorporated charity.

Recruitment and appointment of new trustees

The charity was set up with three original trustees, which is felt to be a suitable number to manage the affairs of the charity. The trust deed allows for a minimum of two and a maximum of eight trustees. New trustees are recruited from the contact base when a trustee retires.

Following the recent death of a trustee, the remaining trustees will be seeking a replacement.

ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

Further explanation of the nature and purpose of each fund is included in the notes to the financial statements.

6. RELATED PARTY DISCLOSURES

The charity has a close relationship with Christian Youth Enterprises Sailing Centre (CYESC), registered charity number 293781. CYE raises bursary funds to enable disadvantaged young people to attend events and courses run by CYESC. In 2018, online donations to the bursary fund totalling £1,522 were raised by CYESC and paid over to CYE. CYE paid £10,174 to CYESC to cover all or part of the cost of 133 disadvantaged young people attending events and courses.
