When planning our activities for the year, the Trustees of Nile Swimmers have considered the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit. The Trustees consider how planned activities will contribute to the aims and objectives they have set.

Drowning kills hundreds of thousands of people every year. Nile Swimmers works to reduce deaths from drowning in Africa. We do this by training to local people to teach swimming and provide water safety education within their communities. Additionally, we conduct research, build partnerships, and provide a voice and a perspective from low income countries.

2018 has been a year of progress. The schools "Aquatic Survival Programme" with the Ministry of Education continues to grow from strength to strength.

Our programmes (and strategic focus) have broadened to include significant research and pilot studies in communities that are vulnerable to flooding.


