		the decline, due to cutbacks in finance.
		During the year we have confirmed our
		arrangement with Exelby Services for the free
		parking of our vehicles and regular access to
		large vehicle washdown. We have recently been granted permission to place a storage container
		alongside the vehicles. We are grateful for the
		generosity of the proprietor.
		We were honoured to receive a Community

		We are working on developing a professionally

A description of the principal risks facing the charity	Para 1.46	All community transport operators are currently at risk to some extent or other if the review of the Section 19 Permit issued by the Traffic Commissioners does away or dramatically changes the principal of "not for hire or reward" This principal is being challenged by the Commercial Bus Association who propose that all volunteer community transport operators must be managed in the same way as commercial operators. We cannot afford to operate on a commercial basis, if forced to we will close as the expenses are beyond our ability to fund and the charges required would be contrary to our charitable objectives. What conclusions the consultation produces are completely out of our control, we have done what we can; we will manage the issues when we know what they are.
