2018 Annual report

Operationally, this year has been dominated by the mass deployment in response to "The Beast From The East" and other named storms during the same winter. These events saw us providing thousands of hours of volunteer time ensuring that the critical services of our blue light and health colleagues were maintained throughout, as well as being fundamental to the coordination of the multi agency response at a strategic and tactical level. Throughout the year we maintained our strong relationship with Dorset Search and Rescue, with our continued operational partnership allowing each organisation to deliver what they do best, working predominantly alongside the Police and HM Coastguard.

This year saw huge strides forward with our Incident Support Unit project. This has seen the purchase and fitout of two bespoke trailer units, allowing us to provide on scene command and control office space, tactical communications with our own responders and partner agencies, as well as comprehensive welfare facilities to ensure we look after our responders. Both trailers are structurally complete and the fitout of the first trailer is complete, with the second well under way. We are also now in the requirements capture phase for an Equipment Support Unit capability, to provide the ability to deploy responders for an extended period and maintain their safety and welfare in the field for longer periods. We would not be able to implement these projects without the incredibly generous help from our sponsors, such as the Talbot Village Trust and Southern and Scottish Electric. Their grants have allowed us to carry out these projects far quicker than would have been possible without their support.

With such a period of change over the last few years, it is appropriate that we take stock and ensure that we capture our new organisational knowledge such that it can be correctly communicated to our members and suitably trained. As such, we are prioritising a project to create handbooks to document our organisational knowledge to protect the organisation from the risks associated with key individuals leaving. This project will take a number of years, but will provide an enduring foundation upon which to grow the organisation further.

Independent examiner's report to the Wessex 4X4 Response

This report on the financial statements of Wessex 4X4 Response for the year ended 31 December 2018 is in respect of an examination carried out in accordance with section 43 of the Charities Act 1993 ("the Act").

Respective responsibilities of Trustees and the examiner

The charity's trustees are responsible for the preparation of the accounts. The charity's trustees consider that an audit is not required for this year under section 144 of the Charities Act 2011 (the Charities Act) and that an independent examination is needed.

It is my responsibility to:

- examine the accounts under section 145 of the Charities Act
- to follow the procedures laid down in the general Directions given by the Charity Commission (under section 145(5)(b) of the Charities Act), and
- to state whether particular matters have come to my attention.

Basis of the report

My examination was carried out in accordance with general Directions given by the Charity Commission. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from the trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit, and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair' view and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

Independent examiner's statement
