Annual Report

for the period from 23rd October 2017 to 31st December 2018

The Balasuriya Foundation CIO was registered in England and Wales as a Charitable Incorporated Organisation on the 23 October 2017 with charity registered number 1175296.

The objects of the charity shall be the advancement of charitable purposes (according to the law of England & Wales) for the benefit of the public, as the trustees see fit from time to time, in particular, but not limited to making grants to charities, or other organisations or individuals working to advance charitable purposes.

Trustees

The trustees who are also the members and served the charity during the period are detailed on Page 1.

New trustees are appointed by the current trustees from people over 16 who have shown a keen interest in the work of the charity and have abilities required on the governing body.

The board shall consist of at least three trustees and at least one of the trustees must be 18 years of age or over. When they are inducted the trustees are presented with a current copy of the constitution and latest annual report and financial statements.

Trustees responsibilities

The Trustees are required to prepare financial statements for each financial period which give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Charity and of its income and expenditure for that period. In preparing those financial statements, the Trustees are required to:

- · select suitable accounting policies and then apply them consistently;
- · make judgements and estimates that are reasonable and prudent;
- state whether applicable accounting standards and statements of recommended practice have been followed, subject to any departures disclosed and explained in the financial statements; and
- prepare the financial statements on the going concern basis unless it is inappropriate to presume that the charity will continue in operation.

The trustees are responsible for keeping accounting records which disclose with reasonable accuracy the financial position of the charity and which enable them to ensure that the financial statements comply with the Charities Act 2011.

Achievements, performance and developments

The foundation has generated income and awarded grants as shown within the financial statements. The charity has been able to offer support the following main charities as well as other smaller grants shown in note 2 to the accounts.

- Capsicum RE Foundation the foundation is a registered charity in England and Wales. It aims to raise funds to make grants to other charitable organisations. The charity granted £2,500 in order to assist with administrative costs to help maximise the grant giving capabilities.
- Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity A charity registered in England and Wales which through linked charities invests in development, research and innovation, welfare and clinical development projects. The Great Ormond Street Hospital Children's Charity aims to transform the health and well being of children not only under its care but also in the care of other institutions would benefit.
- **Mission Smile** a medical charitable trust dedicated to providing free life changing cleft care and surgery for children and adults born with cleft lip, cleft palate and other facial deformations.
- The Quest School A charity registered in England and Wales to act as a specialist school which takes pupils aged 5 to 19 across the autistic spectrum. It looks after and cares about the specific needs of its pupils enabling them to get into life outside the school environment.

Achievements, performance and developments (continued)

 The Wickers - The Wickers is a charity registered in England and Wales which acts as a resource for young people in the Hackney area. It provides advice and assistance by organising programmes of physical education to help young people to develop skills and capabilities to enable them to participate in society.

Public benefit

The trustees consider that the objectives and activities of the charity are in accordance with the Charity Commissions' general guidance on public benefit. The details of public benefit are covered within other areas of this report especially under the heading of 'Achievements, performance and developments'.

The foundation makes grants to charities, or other organisations working to advance charitable purposes, which gives benefit to children, the elderly, those with disabilities, those of different ethnic or racial origin.

Risk assessment

The trustees have considered the major risks to which the charity is exposed and consider that those risks have been currently been negligible. When the charity makes investments then it will need to readdress those risks and ensure that suitable mixes are used and assets are covered by adequate insurance.

The trustees do have a grant making policy which incorporates ensuring that the institutions to which grants are made are suitable and charitable in their own activities.
