Financial Statements

The trustees present their annual report and financial statements of Domlal Foundation Limited (formerly Benoy Foundation Limited), registered number 06317261 and charity number 1120630 for the year ended 31 December 2018.

Structure Governance and Management

On the 5 October 2018 Benoy Foundation Limited changed their name to Domlal Foundation Limited by resolution. Domlal Foundation Limited was incorporated on the 18 July 2007 as a Private company, limited by guarantee without share capital under the Companies Act 1985 and is governed under its memorandum and articles of association. These financial statements cover the year from 1 January 2018 to 31 December 2018. The comparative figures cover the year from 1 January 2017 to 31 December 2017. G S Cartledge was the only director who acted during the year.

The directors of the company are also charity trustees for the purposes of charity law and under the company's Articles. Under the requirements of the Memorandum and Articles of Association the trustees of the Foundation are elected to serve for a specified period after which they must be re-elected at the next Annual General Meeting.

The objectives of Domlal Foundation Limited are to makes grants for such charitable purposes recognised as such according to the law of England and Wales, as the company shall in its absolute discretion determine.

New trustees are appointed by and with the agreement of the continuing trustees in their absolute discretion.

Objectives and Activities

The sole objective and activity is the giving of grants. The trustees have given consideration to the Charities Commission guidance on Public Benefit and consider that their grant giving activities provide public benefit to the wider community.

To achieve the greatest impact, Domlal Foundation Limited works on three inter-linking programmes:

- International: in developing countries
- National: across the United Kingdom
- Local: in Nottinghamshire, its home county

Achievements and Performance

The income of the company during the year amounted to £75,000 (2017: £80,000).

The net assets of the company at 31 December 2018 amounted to £11,499 (2017: £57,049).

During the year the company made donations of £17,247 (2017: £16,000) to Homestart Newark, £47,400 (2017: £Nil) to Bridges to Prosperity, £20,000 (2017: £Nil) to London Wildlife, £5,000 (2017: £Nil) to Marine trust, £25,000 (2017: £Nil) to National Literacy Trust, £Nil (2017: £34,925) to Actionaid Cambodia and £5,000 (2017: £5,000) to Missenden Walled Garden.

Financial Review

1 ACCOUNTING POLICIES

1.1 General information

On the 5 October 2018 Benoy Foundation Limited changed their name to Domlal Foundation Limited by resolution. Domlal Foundation Limited was incorporated on 18 July 2007 under the Companies Act 1985 and is governed under its memorandum and articles of association. The presentation currency for the financial statements is Pounds Sterling (£).

The Principal/Registered office address and the company/charity registration numbers can be found on the company information page. The objectives and activities of the foundation can be found on the Trustees Report.

The following accounting policies have been used consistently in dealing with items which are considered material to the company's affairs:

1.2 Basis of accounting

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention, and in accordance with the requirements of the Charities SORP (FRS 102) and the Charities Act 2011.

The trustees assess whether the use of going concern is appropriate i.e. whether there are any material uncertainties related to events or conditions that may cast significant doubt on the ability of the foundation to continue as a going concern. The trustees make this assessment each year in respect of a period of one year from the date of approval of the financial statements. The trustees have not identified any issues that lead to significant doubt that Domlal Foundation Limited will not be able to continue in the foreseeable future.

1.3 Income

Income represents grants and donations received in the year.

1.4 Grants

Grants are recognised in full in the Statement of Financial Activities in the year in which they are received, except where preconditions for its expenditure in a succeeding period exist.

1.5 Expenditure

Resources expended are recognised in the period in which they are incurred.

1.6 Support costs

Support costs represent expenditure in the year in relation to the administration of the Charity.

1.7 Funds

Unrestricted funds are incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.
