 - b) other forms of recreation and leisure-time occupation with the object of improving the conditions of life for the inhabitants.

After several years of redevelopment, 2018 (as the three previous years) continued the consolidation of the uses of the Halls, with total income almost unchanged from the previous two years.

As in previous years, the building was used by many local organisations and individuals during the year, including regular events and meetings such as the People's Choir, table tennis club, yoga, pilates, the art group, parent and toddler playtime, children and adult dance classes, language tuition, shows, concerts and quiz nights. The hall is also used for parish council meetings, the annual parish meeting, private functions and as the election polling station for the parish.

The cafe, which opens on Tuesday and Thursday afternoons, continued to be a major local facility offering free wi-fi, free international phone calls, newspapers and books and with local produce on sale. The cafe is attended by a mobile hairdresser and, regularly but not at every opening, by Citizens Advice and the local Community Support PC.

The Trustees continue to work under professional guidance to resolve ownership and rights of way disputes with neighbouring properties. Mediation attempts have unfortunately failed and the Charity issued proceedings during the year. We are advised by counsel of good prospects of success. Trustees have been subject to a campaign of intimidation and harassment in relation to these matters, including acid attacks on property. The police have been informed and have investigated, without conclusion. Trustees continue to follow guidance from the police and solicitors in relation to these attacks. Support and advice from the Charity Commission on how to proceed in these matters would be appreciated. There are no further serious issues to report.

Section D

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

As indicated above, 2018 was a year in which the use of the redeveloped Rooms was consolidated. Income was level, but a 13% increase in costs resulted in a 50% decrease in net income from £5.236 to £2.602. Reserves however remained strong: cash at the bank totalled £16,964 against £17,267 the previous year.

The Board consider this financial strength to be an important foundation for the remaining big challenge of the comprehensive redevelopment of the Rooms: the restoration of the Reading Room. The planning and fundraising for this has yet to take place as this must await the outcome of the current ownership and rights of way disputes, which are still on-going.

Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves The Charity's policy is to retain a reserve to cover the working capital required by the charity over a minimum 3-month period. However, previous capital works have been largely grant-funded, whereas the final phase of redevelopment (the major Reading Rooms project) is expected to need significant input from the Charity itself. Accordingly reserves continue to be increased in preparation for that phase.

1. General Information

The Charity is a private company limited by guarantee, registered in England and Wales and a registered charity in England and Wales. The address of the registered office is East Street, St Briavels, Lydney, Gloucestershire, GL15 6TG

2 Statement of Compliance

These financial statements have been prepared in compliance with FRS 102, The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and the Republic of Ireland, the statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS102) (Charities SORP (FRS102)) and the Charities Act 2011.

3 Accounting Policies

Basis of Preparation

The Financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis, as modified by the revaluation of certain financial assets and liabilities measured at fair value through income or expenditure.

The Financial statements are prepared in sterling which is the functional currency of the entity

Going Concern

There are no material uncertainties about the charity's ability to continue

Disclosure Exemptions

The entity satisfies the criteria of being a qualifying entity as defined in FRS 102. As such advantage has been taken of the following disclosure exemptions available under paragraph 1.12 of FRS 102:

- (a) no cash flow statement has been presented for the company
- (b) disclosures in respect of financial instruments have not been presented

Judgements and Key sources of estimation uncertainty

The preparation of the financial statements requires management to make judgements, estimates and assumptions that affects the amounts reported. These estimates and judgements are continually reviewed and are based on experience and other factors, including expectations of future events that are believed to be reasonable under the circumstances.

Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees to further any of the charity's purposes

Designated funds are unrestricted funds earmarked by the directors for particular future projects or commitments

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure declared by the donor or through the terms of an appeal, and fall into one of two sub-classes: restricted income funds or endowment funds.

Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included in the statement of financial activities when entitlement has passed to the charity; it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the transaction will flow to the charity and the amount can be reasonably measured. the following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:

income from donations or grants is recognised when there is evidence of entitlement to the gift, receipt is probable and its amount can be measured reliably.

legacy income is recognised when receipt is probable and entitlement is established.

donated facilities and services are recognised in the accounts when received if the value can be reliably measured. No amounts are included for the contribution of general volunteers.

income from contracts for the supply of services is recognised with the delivery of the contracted service. This is classified as unrestricted funds unless there is a contractual requirement for it to be spent on a particular purpose and returned if unspent, in which case it may be regarded as restricted.

Resources Expended

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis as a liability is incurred. Expenditure includes any VAT which cannot be fully recovered, and is classified under headings of the statement of financial activities to which it relates:

expenditure on raising funds includes the costs of all fundraising activities, events, non-charitable trading activities, and the sale of donated goods.

expenditure on charitable activities includes all costs incurred by a charity in undertaking activities that further its charitable aims for the benefit of its beneficiaries, including those support costs and costs relating to the governance of the charity apportioned to charitable activities.

other expenditure includes all expenditure that is neither related to raising funds for the charity nor part of its expenditure on charitable activities.

All costs are allocated to expenditure categories reflecting the use of the resource. Direct costs attributable to a single activity are allocated directly to that activity. Shared costs are apportioned between the activities they contribute to on a reasonable, justifiable and consistent basis.

Tangible Assets

Tangible assets are recorded at cost, and are capitalised if they can be used for more than one year, and cost at least £500. Any tangible assets carried at revalued amounts are recorded at the fair value at the date of revaluation.

Depreciation

Buildings are depreciated at £10 per annum; fixtures and fittings are depreciated at 10% of original cost per annum.

Stocks

Stocks are measured at the lower of cost or market value.

Financial Instruments

A financial asset or a financial liability is recognised only when the entity becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument.

Basic financial instruments are initially recognised at the amount receivable or payable including any related transaction costs, unless the arrangement constitutes a financing transaction, where it is recognised at the present value of the future payments discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument.

Current assets and current liabilities are subsequently measured at the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received and not discounted.

Debt instruments are subsequently measured at amortised cost.

4 Limited by guarantee

The St. Briavels Assembly Rooms Limited is a company limited by guarantee and accordingly does not have a share capital. Every member promises, if the company is dissolved while he or she remains a member or within one year afterwards, to pay up to £1 towards the cost of dissolution and the liabilities incurred by the charity while he or she was a member.
