<u>Parliamentary Human Rights Trust: Registered Number 327478</u> Charity Trustees' Annual Report 2019 (for Financial Year Ending 31.03.19)

The Parliamentary Human Rights Trust, Registered Number 327478, is administered and managed by a number of UK Parliamentarians, in their capacity as Officers of the Trust and the All-Party Parliamentary Human Rights Group, and is based in the UK Houses of Parliament. The governing document of the trust is the declaration of trust dated 23 January 1987, as amended 26 July 2012 to enable the independent examination of the accounts. In accordance with the declaration of trust, none of the Officers are trustees.

The Chair, and the contact for the Trust, is Rt. Hon. Ann Clwyd MP, whose office address is House of Commons, London, SW1A 0AA.

The names of the current trustees of the Trust are as follows: Baroness D'Souza; Baroness Anelay, appointed as Trustee as of 1 January, 2018; and Baroness Quin, appointed as Trustee as of 1 July, 2018. Lord Rea of Eskdale formally resigned as Trustee as of 28 February, 2018; and, Lord Hylton formally resigned as Trustee as of 18 July, 2018.

The charity's objects are to undertake, promote and commission research into the maintenance and observance of human rights, particularly those set out in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and to disseminate the results of such research to governments, parliamentarians, intergovernmental organisations and the general public in the United Kingdom.

The Trustees have complied with their duty to have due regard to the guidance on public benefit published by the Commission in exercising their powers and duties.

As a means of supporting these objects, the Charity works closely with the All-Party Parliamentary Human Rights Group (PHRG), and pays to employ a coordinator/advisor. A part-time intern was also taken on during this financial year from April to end July, then from September to mid-December, and a new parttime intern worked from end-January to end March; both assisted with external communications and were paid the London living wage for the hours worked. The Trust's costs and outgoings are kept to a minimum as the Parliamentarians, both Officers and Trustees, undertake their work on a voluntary basis.

The PHRG Officers are responsible for the promotion of the objects of the Trust and, to this end, work with other parliamentarians, intergovernmental organisations, NGOs and representatives from the UK and other governments, to decide upon topics to be researched, to collate information and to disseminate research findings. They also respond to enquiries from members of the public in the UK and abroad relating to human rights issues. They are assisted in this regard by the above-mentioned Co-ordinator/Advisor and intern.

Monies are kept in reserve are to ensure the Trust is able to comply with any obligations arising under employment law, including if the Trust had to cease operating.
