The Council presents its Report and the Financial Statements for the year ended 30<sup>th</sup> September 2018.

# Structure, Governance and Management

# Governing document

The organisation is a charitable company limited by guarantee, incorporated on 7 December 1984 and registered with the Charity Commission as a registered charity on 30 November 1962.

The company was established under a Memorandum of Association, which established the objects and powers of the charitable company and is governed under its Articles of Association.

# Recruitment and appointment of Council Members

The current council members are as detailed on page 1.

In accordance with the rules of the Society, a third of the members of Council retire each year by rotation and can offer themselves for re-election at the Annual General Meeting. The Chairman and Vice Chairman are eligible for re-election at the first Council Meeting following the Annual General Meeting.

#### Council Members Induction and Training

Any new council members are given details of the rules and objectives of the Charity.

Further training is provided on request from the Chairman of the Charity.

#### Risk Management

The Council Members have assessed any significant risks that the Charity may be exposed to and have taken measures to ensure any potential risks are minimised.

An Independent Security firm handles all the cash transactions on the Show day, and the council members consider that this reduces the risk.

# **Organisation Structure**

The Council of the Society is responsible for the overall management and control of the charity and regular meetings are held. The Council is also grateful to the many volunteers who give their time to the Society. In total this represents many hours of work which cannot possibly be valued, but without which the Derbyshire Agricultural and Horticultural Society would not be as successful.

The Council believes that it is well placed to fulfil the objectives of the charity into the future.

# Objectives and Activities

The charity is established for the promotion of agriculture, horticulture and rural traditions through the staging of the annual Derbyshire County Show.

The Show is aimed at any and all members of the public. It is widely advertised in the City of Derby as well as the surrounding districts and neighbouring counties and the Show attracts several thousand visitors who can see many facets of rural heritage displayed, including animals, trades and skills.

The many exhibitors at the Show benefit from the chance to showcase their livestock, skill or wares to a wider audience than they may be able to access individually; while members of the public visiting the Show are able to benefit by the gathering of many different goods, produce, livestock, attractions and entertainment on one day at a family friendly event.

The Show opens to the public at 8am and closes at 5.30pm. There is a range of cattle, sheep, horse, dog, rabbit, bird, horticultural and Young Farmers' competitions held throughout the day and many of the competitions are qualifying rounds for national competitions such as Crufts and the Horse of the Year Show. Along with this there are many displays of vintage machinery, cars and tractors, Women's Institute, hedge cutting and dry stone walling. There are classic rides for children including a helter-skelter and carousel. Refreshments are available from a variety of producers. There is as well a main ring with a full programme of displays and entertainment, which has included JCB Dancing Diggers, Monster Truck displays and The Yorkshire Volunteers Marching Band, and every year we also have a Grand Parade of the prizewinning animals in the afternoon.

The Derbyshire Agricultural and Horticultural Society operate as an independent charity.

# Achievement and Performance

This was our second year at Locko Park in Spondon and was one of the best organised, well laid out and enjoyed shows the society has put on in recent years. We had decent weather, but this being said it was not terribly well attended by the public, who make a massive contribution to the finances of the society. The world cup was a big distraction and it is hoped in 2019 the public will be back in big numbers looking for a great family day out close to the city of Derby.

After a disappointing year financially, it has been decided by the council members that we should return to our original showground at Elvaston. We have scrutinised our budget and are making many changes to the show in 2019 whilst hopefully maintaining the high standard we feel the show deserves.

It remains the aim of the society to continue to hold the Derbyshire County Show and try to build up our depleted funds to put the society back on a strong financial footing to sustain its future.

# 1. Accounting policies

# **Basis of Preparation**

Derbyshire Agricultural and Horticultural Society Ltd is a charity in England. In the event of the charity being wound up, the liability in respect of the guarantee is limited to £1 per member of the charity. The address of the registered office is given in the charity information on page 2 of these financial statements. The nature of the charity's operations and principle activities are the promotion of agriculture, horticulture and rural traditions.

The charity constitutes a public benefit entity as defined by FRS 102. The financial statements have been prepared in accordance with Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) issued on 16 July 2014 (as updated through Bulletin 1 published 2 February 2016), the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the United Kingdom and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102), the Charities Act 2011, the Companies Act 2006 and UK Generally Accepted Accounting Practice.

(The charity has applied Update Bulletin 1 as published on 2 February 2016 and does not include a cash flow statement on the grounds that it is applying FRS 102 Section 1A.)

The financial statements are presented in sterling, which is the functional currency of the charity.

# **Going Concern**

The council members have a reasonable expectation that the charity has adequate resources to continue to operate for the foreseeable future. On this basis they continue to adopt the going concern basis in the accounts.

# **Income**

Income is received by way of donations and gifts and is included in full in the Statement of Financial Activities when the charity has entitlement to the funds. The value of services provided by volunteers has not been included.

Income from investments is included in the Statement of Financial Activities when receivable. The Statement of Financial Activities included the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year, if applicable.

Income is stated gross, except for rent income, which is offset against expenditure as the directors consider that the publication of the full information could be commercially detrimental to the Society.

# **Expenditure**

Expenditure is recognised on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all costs related to the category. Expenses include, where applicable, attributable VAT which cannot be recovered.

#### **Tax Status**

The Society is a registered charity and is exempt from Income, Corporation or Capital Gains Tax

#### Value Added Tax

The Society is a partially exempt body for VAT purposes. Expenditure subject to VAT, which is not recoverable, is shown inclusive of VAT in the financial statements.

# **Tangible Fixed Assets**

Depreciation is provided at rates calculated to write off the cost of each asset over its expected useful life, as follows:

Equipment

20% on cost

#### Stocks

Stocks are valued at the lower of cost and net realisable value.

#### **Operating Leases**

Rentals applicable to operating leases are charged to the SOFA over the period in which the cost is incurred.

# **Unrestricted Funds**

Unrestricted funds are donations and other incoming resources receivable or generated for the objects of the charity without further specified purpose and are available as general funds.

#### **Restricted Funds**

Restricted funds are to be used for specific purposes as laid down by the donor. No restricted funds were received during the year.
