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## TRUSTEES' REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31 DECEMBER 2018

The trustees present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31 December 2018. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

## **OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES**

## **Objectives and Activities**

The missions of the Iglesia ni Cristo (Church of Christ) embody its purposes as a Charity. The missions include: advancement of religion with dissemination and propagation of the Christian faith and teachings as written in the Bible, the Holy Scriptures; establishment of local congregations, group worship services, and extensions within the United Kingdom that the dissemination and propagation of this religious faith may reach, subject to existing laws of England and Wales.

Associated with these objectives, the Charity aims to establish places for official use of its members in different congregations such as for worship services, in-house training seminars, counseling, and other charitable services for both members and non-members. As proof of this, in the year of 2018, 4 new extensions were established and the locations are mentioned below including the date of their establishments:

Ipswich 3 August 2018 Heathrow North 2 November 2018 Swindon 2 November 2018 Dublin South 20 December 2018

The Charity is determined to establish additional local congregations and places for official use of its members in the United Kingdom.

Various activities are held to enhance and strengthen the spiritual life of the Church members in general. The activities include holding religious worship, prayer meetings, pastoral visitation of brethren, and propagation of the gospel through bible studies, evangelical missions and distribution of religious publications.

The Charity recognises social and humanitarian concerns. The Charity demonstrates this through continuing community activities locally and elsewhere in the world.

The Charity is determined to engage more in charitable works while expanding its mission and to grow in number for the organisation.

The Charity has developed and adopted policies in the advancement of these objectives and has made no changes to these policies during the year. The Charity has updated the governing document and successfully converted to a Charitable Incorporated Organisation (CIO), in order to modernize its practice and undertake thorough review of its powers.

In the furtherance of the actions that have been carried out by the Charity in registering its operations and activities in Scotland and Northern Ireland, the Charity Trustees have plans to complete the process in 2019, now that the Charity has converted to CIO in England and Wales.

Grants are made customarily to other Iglesia ni Cristo churches worldwide after the Trustees' have assessed the project and ensured it complies with the constitution and the UK Charities Act of 2011.

#### ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

#### Achievements and Performance

The Charity has successfully and significantly met its goals and objectives in expansion through propagation, acquisition of properties, and strengthening of morals and spiritual values of its members.

This year, the Church continued the renovation of the properties to be used by the congregations in Leeds and North Shields, in preparation for the chapel dedications in mid-2019.

Due to the principles of the Church which promote a quality of life guiding people to be honest, law-abiding and God-fearing, the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church of Christ), with all modesty, contributes greatly to the moral and spiritual enrichment of its members to benefit their families and the communities in which the members reside. The leadership members in the Church continue to guide members to be considerate to the welfare of others in the spirit of love and compassion. This has been the hallmark of the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church of Christ) for more than a century of its existence in the Philippines, and more than half a century in the United Kingdom, the Church continues to contribute to the community through various charitable activities, which are called INC Giving activities. The INC Giving activities are open to everyone in the community, whether or not they are members of the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church of Christ).

The Charity holds the above-mentioned activities to promote the enhancement of social and cultural values of its members, by guiding them to wholesome and enriching activities in sports, music and the arts.

These are activities are held by the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church of Christ) in order to strengthen the faith of the members of the Church who participate and can strengthen the bond between them in a fun and friendly environment. Non-Church members are also invited to these events, so that they can have more exposure to the Christian faith and teachings upheld in the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church Of Christ).

The Charity also carries out outreach work to assist people who are suffering as a result of poverty, natural disasters and catastrophes, regardless of their religious beliefs. This is because the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church Of Christ) embraces the teaching of the Bible to love our neighbours, countrymen and brethren. Therefore the Charity has also been helping the Iglesia Ni Cristo (Church Of Christ) Central Administration's program on International Aid to Humanity, which benefits many impoverished people in various parts of the world.

## FINANCIAL REVIEW

## **Financial Review**

After reviewing the Charity's financial position at the end of the reporting period, the Trustees are satisfied with the financial position at the Balance Sheet date.

The policy of the Charity remains that unrestricted funds not designated for a specific use should be maintained at a level equivalent to between three and six months expenditures. The Trustees foresee that this level of reserved amounts will ensure that the Charity will be able to continue the current activities should there be a significant drop in funding. During this allotted time, the Trustees will then promote ways in which additional funds may be raised. This group has successfully maintained this goal of reserves throughout the year.

There are no uncertainties about the Charity's ability to continue. The Trustees also maintains that there are no funds or subsidiary undertakings that are materially in deficit.

## STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Structure, Governance and Management

The Charity was established as a Charitable Trust deed on 10 May 1973.

The Chairman of the Board of Trustees appoints the Trustees when a vacancy would arise.

Their induction includes the following: meeting the office staff; being briefed on procedures; updates being issued by concerned government agencies affecting their roles; and addressing any training needs they may have.

The Trustees manage the Charitable Trust together, and ensure that the expenditures of all funds received are in accordance with the trust deed.

This Charitable Trust is part of a wider network, also called Iglesia ni Cristo (Church Of Christ), an international Christian denomination religion originating in the Philippines and is currently located around the world.

The Trustees are responsible for the management of risks that the Charity would face. The Trustees have undertaken a full risk assessment of the organization and have introduced various key controls. The trustees also review these controls regularly. The Trustees have assessed the major risks to which the Charity is exposed, and are satisfied that systems are in place to mitigate exposure to the major risks.

One of the key risks for the Charity is the impact of a negative event on the Charity's reputation. The Trustees are satisfied that a policy and action plan has been put in place to ensure adequate control of this risk.

## 1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charity, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Charities Act 2011. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

#### Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

#### Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Grants offered subject to conditions which have not been met at the year end date are noted as a commitment but not accrued as expenditure.

#### Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Depreciation is not provided in respect of freehold properties as the Trustees believe that the present market value is not less than the cost stated in the accounts. The Charity also follows a regular programme of maintaining the properties in a good state by way of incurring expenditure on repairs and maintenance.

#### Taxation

The charity is exempt from tax on its charitable activities.

#### Fund accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees.

Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes.

#### Hire purchase and leasing commitments

Rentals paid under operating leases are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities on a straight line basis over the period of the lease.

#### Pension costs and other post-retirement benefits

The charity operates a defined contribution pension scheme. Contributions payable to the charity's pension scheme are charged to the Statement of Financial Activities in the period to which they relate.

#### **Restricted funds**

#### Building renovation and purchases

These restricted funds are received from other related charities. The funds are restricted to the purchase and renovation of properties, mainly to be used for worship services, training and seminars, counselling and other charitable services for both members and non-members.

#### Local funds

These restricted funds are received in the form of cash donations from the local congregations. The funds are created for local expenditure only.

### **District funds**

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These restricted funds are received in the form of cash donations from the local congregations. The funds are created for district and local expenditure only. The district is defined as the UK.

#### 15. EVENTS SINCE THE END OF THE YEAR

#### Constitution

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Both during the year and since the year end date, the Trustees have been actively involved in amending the Constitution in order to bring it in line with the Charity's current activities and locations, in order to achieve compliance with regulations.

#### **Charitable Incorporated Organisation**
