## Purposes

Warrington Youth for Christ aims to take good news relevantly to every young person in Warrington. A copy of the Constitution of Warrington Youth for Christ may be obtained by writing to the Chairman at the above address.

#### Chairman's Report 2018

WYFC is all about mission and this year has seen many opportunities to "take the Good News of Jesus relevantly to every young person in Warrington" as we say in our mission statement. The year started with Pure Creative arts' visit and ends with Nicola mission. In between we had the river mission with a team of local young people. The chaplaincy work at Creamfields was a chance to demonstrate God's love to festival-goers who needed help either practically or to consider spiritual issues.

WYFC did all the local organisation for the successful Celebrate and Renovate Youth Evangelists' Conference which was held in Warrington in 2018.

As well as these successes, during the year we also had some setbacks with a few issues over cashflow and Keith's contract to work with Culcheth Methodist Church had to be finished early as things didn't work out with the church. The potential YFC centre in Widnes looks less likely to happen now that Widnes Churches have decided not to continue with Cayley's contract as result of new priorities in Widnes (Transform NorthWest) and also her school (OCA) became less open to Christian work in the school.

During 2018 we welcomed Wendy Gaffney as a new trustee. Wendy was impressed by the work in Birchwood undertaken by Sam Parnell and after seeing the impact on her children, decided that she wanted to offer her services to WYFC. There were no changes to the Council of Reference.

Trustees worked on a variety of things during 2018:

- · GDPR preparation involved a review of the basis on which we hold all our contact details and a full refresh of the database.
- Fund raising (including raising money to pay for a fundraiser, Stuart Cheil to apply to trusts on our behalf). As a result of
  cash-flow issues the trustees looked at selling assets, increasing Church visits by the staff team to get out and meet potentia
  supporters, as well as developing relationships with current ones, all with the aim of increasing income.
- BYFC have changed their chartering process and autumn 2018 was the first time we re-chartered via the new system, adopting the latest BYFC policies for things such as data handling updated for GDPR and also safeguarding. In September 2018 BYFC rebranded with a new logo, new mission statement and a new website template, all of which cascaded through to local centres, including Warrington as a result of which we have an updated website.
- Consulted with local churches to see if they would fund a new Stockton Heath worker after KIm asked to change roles from 2 part time jobs (Stockton Heath and Latchford) to focussing her efforts in Latchford. The outcome was unexpected- rather than money, one of the local churches (St Thomas) offered to second their youth worker, Adam Post, to WYFC for part of each week to work In Bridgewater high school (In Stockton Heath).
- On the administration side, the biggest change has been the move from paper to the cloud with the introduction of G Suite which was installed and set up by Simon Fawcett. The switch to G-Suite is under way and will include all day to day admin (e.g. team time-sheets and expenses) as well as documents such as minutes of trustee meetings

Finally I'd like to thank all the staff team, trustees, and volunteers for their hard work throughout the year.

### Independent Examiner's Report to the Trustees

I report on the accounts of Warrington Youth for Christ for the year ended 31 December 2018, which are set out on pages 6 to 12.

#### Respective responsibilities of trustees and examiner

### Notes to the Accounts

#### **1** Accounting Policies

#### **Basis of accounting**

The financial statements have been prepared under the historic cost convention and in accordance with applicable accounting standards, the Charities SORP 2005 (Accounting and Reporting by Charities) and with the Charities Act 2011

#### Taxation

WYFC is a registered charity and accordingly is exempt from taxation on its income and gains where they are applied for charitable purposes. The charity is not registered for Value Added Tax

#### **Related party transactions**

None of the trustees were paid any remuneration or expenses by the charity during the year (2017 : Nil )

#### Depreciation

Depreciation on all fixed assets is at the rate of 25% per annum on a reducing balance basis

#### Funds Accounting

The Act requires separate presentation of the accounts for Restricted, Designated and General Funds

#### Restricted Funds

"Restricted Funds" are only those funds where there is a legal or contractual obligation on the charity by the grant provider to utilise the funds for specific purposes

#### Designated Funds

"Designated Funds" represent funds which have been set aside for a particular purpose at the discretion of the Trustees and are not restricted

#### **Designated and Restricted Funds**

"Designated and Restricted Funds" represent funds which have been set aside for a particular purpose at the discretion of the Trustees and are restricted

#### **General Funds**

"General Funds" constitute the remainder of the funds that are not subject to any restrictions regarding their use

#### Incoming Resources

Donations, legacies and similar incoming resources are included in the year in which they are receivable which is when the charity becomes entitled to the resource

Income Tax on Gift Aid, together with interest received from the Inland Revenue, are recognised at the point of receipt ( of the gift ) and both are shown as "other incoming resources"

Interest received on savings is recognised when credited to the account

### Expenditure

All expenditure is included on an accruals basis and is recognised when there is a legal or constructive obligation to pay for it. All costs have been attributed to one of the functional categories or resources expended in the Statement of Financial Activities
