Charity's Activities and Achievements during the year

The charity is managed by a Management Committee. The Chairman is elected by the Committee and all members who put themselves forward and re-elected at the Annual General Meeting.

In planning our activities for the year the Committee has kept in mind at our meeting the Charity Commissions guidelines on public benefit.

The leadership is encouraged to keep abreast of the latest requirements of the law and best practice when dealing with young people and to this end the application to the Federation of Boys and Girls clubs of Greater Manchester is most helpful.

Risks

The Management Committee have identified the major risks to which the Charity is exposed and have taken steps to mitigate those risks.

Finances

The attached financial statements show the state of finances which the Committee consider to be satisfactory.

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Reserves

The Management Committee have reviewed the reserves of the Charity and have concluded that to allow the charity to be managed efficiently and to continue its current activities, unrestricted fund reserves should be not less than 9 months anticipated expenditure. On this basis the current requirement is £10,000; at 31st March 2019 actual reserves were £36,192 which the Trustees consider is a satisfactory level.

The Chairman's Report 2018–2019

What another fantastic year for Norbrook Youth Club, it gave me a great sense of pride and achievement as we celebrated our 60th anniversary which was planned to the last detail. The day was attended by so many important people including the Lord Mayor of Manchester and our beloved Freda Fishwick. I am so glad we caught this on film because we will all look back with fond memories as we celebrated together. Another unexpected outcome was a cheque for 50K of capital funding from the Garfield Weston Foundation which will benefit generations of young people as we look to extend our facility and build a new games room. One thing is for certain in my voluntary role is that there is no switch off, no sitting down and no being complacent because opportunities present themselves all the time. One minute I can be dealing with an important funding application at home while my kids drive me mental, the next I can be recruiting a complete stranger to join us who has dared show interest in my story about Norbrook.

It has been a very busy year for our small committee but it is down to their determination and skills that we are in this fantastic position. I would like to recognise them in my report for supporting me as Chairman because their energy drives me to keep going as leader. Steph has done so much to improve our outreach on social media and put together a brilliant business plan. Our youngest committee members Shannon and Karolina continue to be the face of our club by being in the funding video, attending events to showcase what we do and literally wearing the t-shirt at any given opportunity. They are future leaders of community centres in Wythenshawe. Emma in particular has done so much to assist me with all the tricky parts of running the club not to mention bringing in 10K of Heritage Lottery Funding for the 60th anniversary and mapping out great history on the wall. I was so pleased when Emma put herself forward for vice chair and for the first time in my position it felt like I could go on holiday leaving someone in command. Nice one Emma. Each of them can take all the credit for putting back so much in to Wythenshawe, they are outstanding leaders and true volunteers who care.

Our financial position is good and we remain sustainable with a sensible approach to making sure we can run a building annually in the most viable way. Treasurer Steve has been on the committee at lot longer than me and he is someone who's knowledge of running a charity is crucial in watching the pennies. Thank you Steve.

We can certainly get better at recycling and being greener so that is something we should take more seriously in 2019-21.

Our youth offer continues to be really good. Wythenshawe Community Housing Group continue to provide a good youth offer for the senior age group three evenings a week and a new partner joined us in September Manchester Young Lives who have started a popular after school club for the juniors two evenings a week. MCC Active Lifestyle Zumba session remains popular on Tuesday evenings and at superb value at £1. Baguley Athletic Football Club and Norbrook have struck a good relationship simply by offering one another support in sharing good practice. There will be more to come from this next year we hope.

Norbrook has always looked to focus on providing an offer for young people in Wythenshawe but our longest serving residents Later Life Living who provide day care support to older people with dementia deserve credit for delivering a professional and caring service. My visits are always pleasant during the day because I can see what care and support they give to so many who need it and I don't think I have appreciated how much they love our facility by keeping it clean and tidy for all our users. Dawn and Kyra want to build up their clients from Wythenshawe and we want to assist as much as possible.

Our connection with the Boys and Girls Clubs of Greater Manchester is stronger than ever and a visit from Karen the Chair last year was a pertinent moment for me as Chairman. Andy Hamil has been nothing but supportive from the moment we met in 2007 and he is always somebody who flies the flag for BGCGM and every single club connected. The BGCGM are vital to clubs like Norbrook and we need to keep on standing beside one another in the future.

Looking back overall on everything at Norbrook I often wonder what the old Chairman Bill Fishwick would say if he were here. I would like to think that he would be proud that nothing stopped when he stood down and that every single bit of passion and history continue to move forward.
