Objectives and activities

OUR AIMS

2:52 Challenge operates under a Constitution of a Charitable Incorporated Organisation whose only voting members are the charity trustees dated 25 July 2016 and was sealed by the Charity Commissioners for England and Wales on 30 May 2017.

The objects of the charity are to advance the Christian faith for the benefit of the public, especially young people under 25 years, in accordance with the 2:52 Challenge statement of belief, to advance in life and relieve the needs of people, especially young people and to promote the education (including social and physical training) of people including those under the age of 25 years.

Summary of the objects of the charity set out in its governing document

We aim, to provide weekly, educational, free-time activities based on Christian principles. And to provide travel opportunities that embeds learning and develops new skills. Through our 2:52 Challenge programme we aim to develop life skills, healthy living, Christian spiritual growth and citizenship, building self-confidence and a desire to contribute to the wider community. In doing so, we introduce participants to new experiences and prepare them for later life.

OUR OBJECTIVES

In setting our objectives and planning our activities our Trustees have given careful consideration to the Charity Commission's public benefit guidance.

Our key objectives for the year included:

- Test and develop the latest version of the 2:52 Challenge programme
- Expand the provision of the 2:52 Challenge programme

- Develop stronger links with our overseas, short-term mission partner
- Review and update all governance documents

Test and develop the latest version of the 2:52 Challenge programme

We have continued to test the 2:52 Challenge level 1 programme at our Scunthorpe Baptist Church weekly youth meetings. Participation here has been an average of 6-7 young people aged 14 to 21 years of age. Activities have included cooking skills, fitness classes, prayer meetings, Bible studies, and volunteering opportunities.

Expand the provision of the 2:52 Challenge programme

In October 2017 we launched a new 2:52 Challenge group on Scunthorpe's Riddings Estate. There was an average of 15-30 participants each week between the ages of 14-17 years. This group was forced to close after 12 months due to dangerous and anti-social behaviour on the estate at the time. Plans are in place to move to Scunthorpe's Crosby area instead.

This year we have begun to develop resources that we plan to make available to other churches/organisations so that others can deliver the 2:52 Challenge programme.

Develop stronger links with our overseas, short-term mission partner

Soapbox Trips, part of Act4Africa is the organisation that we chose to provide the Get Overseas part of the 2:52 Challenge programme. In September 2017, Act4Africa announced that they no longer wished to provide short practical aid trips and that Soapbox Trips would close. After considering the impact this would have on the 2:52 Challenge programme we incorporated the name and business activities of Soapbox Trips.

Achievements and performance

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

Test and develop the latest version of the 2:52 Challenge programme

- Young people have learned at least 5 out of 10 recipes.
- Three have completed a level 2 Health and Hygiene course
- Six participants have learned map reading skills, compass skills and taken part in a short pilgrimage around the different churches in the town, where they learnt about the different denominations and the purpose behind pilgrimages.
- All the young people have completed fitness circuit training and know what exercises they can completed as a group and at home to increase their fitness level and healthy lifestyle.
- All young people have taken part in indoor fitness activities including badminton, table tennis and swimming.
- All participants have taken part in a Bible study course introducing them to the basics of Christianity
- All young people have completed, health and safety and safeguarding awareness training.
- Half of the group has completed 15 hours or more of volunteering, with two participants completing more than 100 hours of volunteering.
 - Volunteering has included supporting the Rotary Club to host a Local Disability Games, supporting the local church to host activities for adults with disabilities and volunteering in various school programmes.
- One participant took part in a two week volunteering placement in Romania where they visited and encouraged the homeless and some of the poorest families in the country.
