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REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2019

The trustees who are also directors of the charity for the purposes of the Companies Act 2006, present their report with the financial statements of the charity for the year ended 31st March 2019. The trustees have adopted the provisions of Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015).

OBJECTIVES AND ACTIVITIES

Objects of the charity

The provision of training and other facilities to help young people and teenagers from the county of Surrey develop their physical and mental capacities, so that they may grow to realise their full potential.

Activities of the charity

The charity supports projects that aim to:-

- a) identify young people in Surrey, mainly in the 13 to 18 years of age range, whose relationships have broken down and whose experiences have left them with feelings of despair and alienation and no sense of purpose and fulfilment,
- b) enable these young people to meet hitherto unmet challenges in their lives by working alongside them and offering encouragement, trust and support and
- c) encourage and build on young people's strengths and abilities and enable them to realise their full potential as members of the community.

Public benefit

The trustees confirm that they have referred to the guidance contained in the Charity Commissioner's general guidance on public benefit when reviewing the Charity's aims and objectives and in planning future activities.

The trustees are satisfied that the charity continues to meet the required public benefit test through its objectives and activities.

REPORT OF THE TRUSTEES FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2019

ACHIEVEMENT AND PERFORMANCE

Charitable activities

Achievements and performance in 2018-19

We have just completed the third year of our contract with Surrey and Borders NHS Trust to deliver 1:1 support to children and young people referred to the Surrey Mindsight CAMHS service. 2018/19 has seen significant service expansion. We have recruited and trained four new practitioners and opened a new delivery venue in central Guildford to provide a more convenient location for families from the west of the county. Consequently, our waiting lists and waiting times have reduced significantly. We are now very pleased to report that children and young people are now waiting around just eight weeks for a service. We are currently delivering around 85 1:1 sessions every week. Our current target was to provide 2646 sessions in 2018/19 and we completed the year ahead of forecast.

This year we began to offer group sessions (Understanding Autism) to parents whose children show signs of ASD ie pre diagnosis. The course lasts four weeks in total and aims to empower parents who have concerns about their child. It helps parents to gain a clearer understanding of ASD, their child's strengths and difficulties and to explore some positive parenting strategies. This has been very successful and we are now planning to offer on a regular basis throughout 2019/20.

Client satisfaction reports continue to be most encouraging. On a satisfaction scale with 5 as the highest level of satisfaction 88% of participants ranked us as 4 or higher and 98% of all those asked said they would recommend Learning Space to others.

This contract will run an additional two years until March 2021.

This year our 121SPACE mentoring project commissioned by Surrey County Council has supported 102 young people across Reigate and Banstead and Tandridge. Our programme works with children, young people and families to draw on strengths, set goals and support opportunities. We have excellent relationships with all secondary schools across the boroughs and our outreach offer enables children and young people who are unable to access mainstream, specialist services and social opportunities to build a safe and trusting relationship with their mentor over time.

Outcomes have been positive and include improved access to school and learning, better relationships with adults and peers, young people better able to manage feelings and emotions, improved levels of personal resilience and self-confidence.

This contract is due to end December 2019.

In addition to these two contracts we have continued to deliver a weekly support service to ten schools - mixture of primary and secondary.

FINANCIAL REVIEW

Financial Review for 2018-19

The results for the year show that the Charity made a surplus for the year of £50,353 which is an increase on last year's surplus of £41,882.

The reserves of the Charity also increased form £138,738 as at 31st March 2018 to £189,091 as at 31st March 2019.

The results for the year reflect the additional counselling services carried out by Learning Space through its contract with Surrey & Borders NHS Trust.

Reserves policy

The charity has established that reserves should be held which amount to four months operational costs. As at 31st March 2019, the charity can confirm that this objective has been met.

STRUCTURE, GOVERNANCE AND MANAGEMENT

Governing document

The charity's governing document is its Memorandum and Articles of Association dated 17th February 1997 and as amended on 29th November 2000 and 25th May 2005.

Organisational structure

Learning Space is governed by its Board of Trustees, which meets three times each year. It delegates day to day authority to the Management Committee.

One of the Learning Space practitioners also attends the Management Committee meeting to represent the organisation's employees.

Trustee selection method

Trustees are selected from interested local persons representing community professions, for example the police, clergy, medical professionals and counselling services.

NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2019

1. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Basis of preparing the financial statements

The financial statements of the charitable company, which is a public benefit entity under FRS 102, have been prepared in accordance with the Charities SORP (FRS 102) 'Accounting and Reporting by Charities: Statement of Recommended Practice applicable to charities preparing their accounts in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (FRS 102) (effective 1 January 2015)', Financial Reporting Standard 102 'The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland' and the Companies Act 2006. The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention.

Income

All income is recognised in the Statement of Financial Activities once the charity has entitlement to the funds, it is probable that the income will be received and the amount can be measured reliably.

The following specific policies are applied to particular categories of income:-

- 1. Donations and similar incoming resources are only included in the SOFA when the charity has unconditional entitlement to the resources.
- 2. Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable.
- 3. Where incoming resources have related expenditure the incoming resources and related expenditure are reported gross in the SOFA.

Expenditure

Liabilities are recognised as expenditure as soon as there is a legal or constructive obligation committing the charity to that expenditure, it is probable that a transfer of economic benefits will be required in settlement and the amount of the obligation can be measured reliably. Expenditure is accounted for on an accruals basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where costs cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

Tangible fixed assets

Depreciation is provided at the following annual rates in order to write off each asset over its estimated useful life.

Computer equipment

- 25% on reducing balance

Taxation

The charity is exempt from corporation tax on its charitable activities.

Fund accounting

The unrestricted funds are available for use at the discretion of the trustees in furtherance of the general objectives of the charity and have not been designated for other purposes.

Restricted funds are subjected to restrictions on their expenditure imposed by the donor.

Charitable company

The charitable company, Learning Space, (charity number 1061545, company number 03325809), is a company limited by guarantee and has no share capital.
