Structure, governance and management

Type of governing document:

- Charity Commission Scheme including appointment of Trustees dated 15 February 1990.
 Composition of the body of Trustees:
- The body of trustees shall consist when complete of seven competent persons being one ex-officio trustee, three nominated trustees and three co-opted trustees. The nominated trustees shall be appointed for a term of 4 years and the co-opted trustees for a term of 5 years.

Objects of the charity set out in its governing body

The area of benefit is the area of the Ecclesiastical Parish of St. Mark, Teddington and St. John the Baptist, Hampton Wick, together with St. Mary with St. Alban in Teddington.

Subject to the payment of the expenses of management, the Trustees shall pay out of the yearly income of the Charity a sum of not less than £50 and not more than £1,000 or such other amount as may be approved by the Commissioners to the Parochial Church Council of the existing Ecclesiastical Parish of St.Mark, Teddington and St. John the Baptist, Hampton Wick, for application by that council in or towards the maintenance and upkeep of the Church of St. John the Baptist in that ecclesiastical parish.

Provided that if at any time the Church Commissioners establish a pastoral scheme which creates a new ecclesiastical parish and as a result of which the said church is situated therein then the Trustees shall pay the said sum to the parochial Church Council of the new ecclesiastical parish for application by that council in like manner.

Trustees' Annual Report from 1 April 2018 to 31 March 2019

Subject thereto the Trustees shall apply the said income as follows:-

- (a) One third thereof for the promotion of education in the area of benefit, in accordance with various provisions further detailed; and
- (b) Two thirds for relief in need, also with various provisions further detailed.

Summary of the main achievements of the charity during the year

The Trustees met three times in July and October 2018 and in January 2019.

Historically income for the charity has come from just three sources – rent from property, from dividends from investments and from bank interest.

The Charity owns a commercial property in Walton-on-Thames, purchased in June 2016 at a cost of £657,404. Rents received in the year 2018-19 amounted to £44,433 (previous year: £34,478).

Dividends received were £11,028 (2017-18: £10,690) and interest from investments and the bank £662 (2017-18: £265).

No grant was again paid to St John & St Mark PCC (£5,000 had been granted in the year 2013-14). Out of the residue of income received, £16,314 (2017-18: £4,341) was donated from the Promotion of Education Fund and £26,901 from the Relief in Need Fund (2017-18: £15,920). Out of the Relief in Need Fund, £3,550 was donated to individuals in need; £6,754 for the hire of the Bullen Hall for the Good Fellowship Club and gifts for members; £16,357 to other organisations; and £240 as Christmas gifts to former Normansfield residents.

Financial Review

Cash balances at the bank and COIF at 31st March 2019 totalled £158,625 (2018: £152,246).

The Charity also holds 12,046 COIF units worth at financial year end £184,365 (2018: £171,294) and Charifund, Charishare and Charinco units valued in total at £123,611 (2018: £122,046).

Reserves Policy: In view of the very healthy reserves at the present held by the Charity and that our outgoing commitments are very small in comparison, and the fact that if our income was to drop significantly in any year it would cause no financial problems, it has been agreed at the present we do not need to hold any reserves separately, but that we would review the position annually.

The trustees declare that they have approved the trustees' report above.
