To promote humane behaviour towards animals, in particular the German Shorthaired Pointer (GSP) breed, by providing appropriate care, protection, treatment and security for animals which are in need of care and attention by reason of sickness, maltreatment, poor circumstances or ill usage and to educate the public in matters pertaining to animal welfare in general and the prevention of cruelty and suffering among animals.

In summary our activities are:

- to provide education and advice to the general public about the German Shorthaired Pointer breed.
- to assist owners and, in some cases, to directly rehabilitate GSPs to ensure they can be placed into a home whilst and ensuring the welfare of the animal is met and the public is protected from a potential nuisance,
- to provide temporary sanctuary in registered kennels in exceptional circumstances, where the health and welfare of the dog or people is a concern,
- to facilitate the successful rehoming of UK based GSPs which are surrendered to us due to unfortunate circumstances or neglect,
- to support the rehoming of GSPs suffering from neglect or unfortunate circumstances from other rescues in the UK and potentially, other countries, where possible, and
- to support GSP owners in helping them to provide the most positive environment for their dogs.

\*\*We confirm the trustees have had regard to the Charity Commission's guidance on public benefit.

In providing our services, we support the community as a whole in that we prevent animals having aggression, escaping to becoming a public nuisance and helping owners prevent their animals becoming a nuisance while in their control.

German Shorthaired Pointers (GSP) are not the breed for everyone. They certainly are not for the faint of heart or weak of spirit! They are a special breed with specific needs. GSPs were originally bred with several definite goals in mind: a versatile, tireless hunting dog capable of hunting feathered and furred game, pointing or treeing as necessary, retrieving to hand over land or water, and tracking wounded game. A dog capable of dispatching predators. A dog who is a loving, loyal family companion and hearth-warmer. A vigilant watchdog capable of guarding his home and family. All of these goals and more have been realized in the GSP. These same characteristics highlight many issues that should be considered prior to choosing a GSP as your companion.

There is in increased trend in behavioural issues and in particular separation anxiety in dogs that we are asked to rehome. We are discussing the issue with the relevant GSP clubs to ensure they communicate this issue to breeders and training clubs.

# Brief statement of the charity's policy on reserves

The Reserves Policy for the GSP Trust's aim is to hold a sum for two critical areas.

Reviewed Reserve Policy and combined Veterinary Care and Kennelling into one fund and increased amount to hold.

Established separate Benevolent fund at request of GSP community. General feedback is that the community approves the assistance of third parties in need of assistance with dogs outside of UK on a limited bases but prefer funds for these activities to be separate

- 1. £15k Emergency medical & kennelling care including a sum for any commitment for pre-existing conditions for animals rehomed.
- 2. £10k Foreign Benevolent Fund
  These funds should be sufficient to meet any unforeseen item of major expenditure and / or to be able to continue, in the short term, funding planned activities to support our activities. It is necessary to hold sufficient working capital to enable the payment of third parties for the above-mentioned activities. We look to change the basis of the reserve holding in line with population to support and demographics of GSP population.

# Details of any funds materially in deficit

The charity Balance Sheet cash funds currently stand at approximately £20,000 which is £5000 short of target above We continue to increase funds to full value but are currently building reserve fund at approximately £9k per year.

Need for Trading subsidiary – we have reviewed our business plans and fund requirements and established that any trading activity we may perform will be below the small trading threshold and we have no need for a separate entity.

Public Benefit - All trustees have reviewed the operations of the Charity in line with Charity Commission requirements to ensure we continue to meet the public benefit requirement.

Our key areas public benefit this past year include:

- 1. Assisting families with rehoming dogs due divorce, serious illness death and change in personal circumstances. This reduces concerns and stress on families and individuals going through difficult times.
- 2. Rehoming dogs, causing a nuisance in their current homes, to more appropriate homes thus increasing health and welfare of both individuals and dogs.
