Introduction

The Charity's objects ("the objects") are to promote the welfare of persons suffering from senile dementia and other forms of confusional states by the provision of advice in the care of such persons and by the provision of respite care in the borough of Spelthorne.

Chairman's Statement

We are sorry to have lost John Atkins, Carol Coleman and Patsy Durrant as Trustees of the charity. We thank them for their commitment and contribution and wish them well in the future.

I am really pleased to report that we have recovered from last year's deficit of £10,790 and with some prudent cost management posted a surplus of £41,436. Our ethos is to run CAMEO with all the rigour of a small business, but to balance the books over an annual time period. If we make a surplus, this is a bonus and helps prepare reserves to protect the charity through potential difficult future periods if they occur or support viable and sustainable opportunities for expansion.

This recovery is the result of a modest improvement in the number of people funded by Surrey County Council, cost recovery as a result of our Outreach Worker retiring and finding more innovative ways to market our services in the local community.

The number of places we fill each week has sustained at around 240.

We have also introduced a quite informal Care Café for primary carers, so they can have a forum to share experiences and the day-to-day challenges they face. This has proved enormously positive and welcomed by those who attend.

It continually proves difficult to recruit new Trustees. We must find enthusiastic and innovative successors who can become driving force behind the charity through its next period of evolution.
